One of the many programs that has been successful due to its innovative, cultural approach; and now, also identified as a promising practice is The RAIZ Promotores Mental Health Prevention Program which consists of twelve full time individuals, contracted under various non-profit agencies targeted at reaching the Spanish speaking community in Stanislaus County.
