They also help connect TAYA individuals to mental health programs on site. The two mental health programs are identified as Josie's Service Team and Josie's TRAC Telecare. Both programs serve ages 18-25. Criteria that qualify for the Drop-in-Center's space are TAYA individuals at the age of 16-25.
