Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion Newsletter: Genesis	Amaeo Beasley, Clinical Serv Tech II	<p>Genesis is an opioid treatment program that offers both detoxification and maintenance medication assisted treatment. Current medication services include treatment with methadone and access to life saving naloxone. The function of methadone is to control withdrawal symptoms, manage cravings and block the euphoric effects of illicit opioids. Genesis services may be accessed via walk in or telephone request. Assessment, laboratory testing and physical exam are required prior to receiving services. An individual must be determined to have Opioid Use Disorder, Severe with Physiological Dependence on Opioids to qualify for treatment.
