HOW DO WE GET TO PATTERSON?

Patterson is approximately 32 miles south of Tracy on I-5 or 27 miles north of Santa Nella on I-5 or 16 miles west of Turlock on West Main St.

➤ FROM THE BAY AREA:

Travel east on 580 to southbound I-5; Exit I-5 at the Patterson exit (Sperry Rd.),
Travel east on Sperry Rd. to South 9th St.,
Turn left and go one mile to the Patterson Junior High School.

➤ FROM SACRAMENTO:

Travel southbound on I-5,
Exit I-5 at the Patterson exit (Sperry Rd.),
Travel east on Sperry Rd. to south 9th St.,
Turn left and go one mile to the Patterson Junior High School.

➤ FROM SAN JOSE/GILROY:

Travel Hwy 152 east to northbound I-5,
Exit I-5 at the Patterson exit (Sperry Rd.),
Travel east on Sperry Rd. to south 9th St.,
Turn left and go one mile to the Patterson Junior High School.

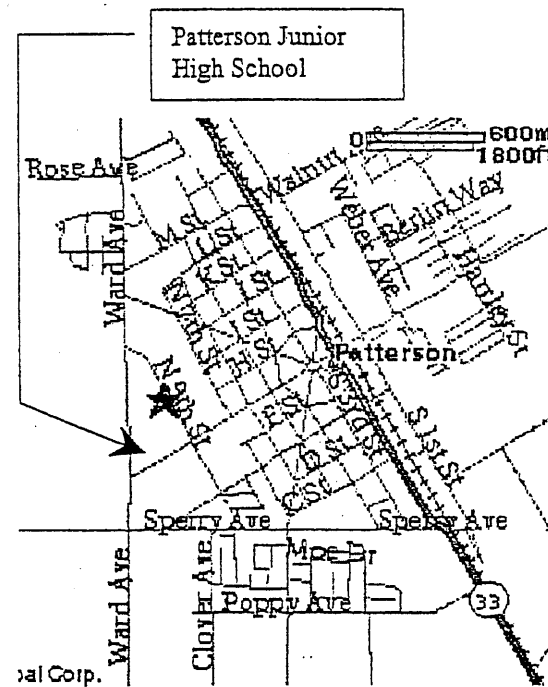
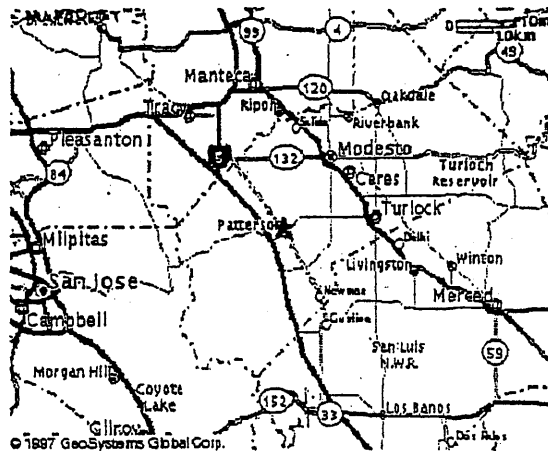
➤ FROM LOS ANGELES:

Travel northbound on I-5,
Exit I-5 at the Patterson exit (Sperry Rd.),
Travel east on Sperry Rd. to south 9th St.,
Turn left and go one mile to the Patterson Junior High School.

➤ FROM THE FRESNO AREA:

Travel Hwy 99 to Turlock,
Turn west on West Main St.,
Continue west on West Main/Las Palmas,
Turn south on Hwy 33,
Turn west on Sperry Rd. to South 9th St.,
Turn right and go one mile to the Patterson Junior High School.

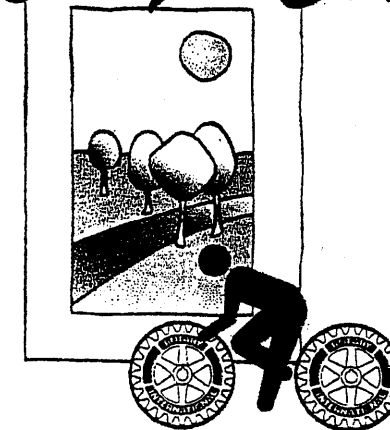

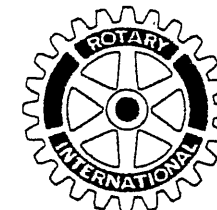

The Century

102 miles (approx.) - Travel through Stanislaus, Santa Clara, San Joaquin and Contra Costa Counties on a beautiful and challenging ride through valley farmland with 5,500' of climbing up Del Puerto Canyon and then proceeding along San Antonio Valley Road for lunch in picturesque Livermore Valley vineyards. Then climb Corral Hollow on the return to Patterson.

Where - Patterson Junior High School on 9th Street.

When to check in and start:

- Century 6 AM to 8 AM
- Metric Century 6 AM to 8 AM
- Quarter Century 9 AM to 10 AM

What you'll get for \$25 - a well marked road and route map, SAG support, rest stops, lunch, water bottle, ID bracelet, bicycle inspection, a designer patch, and other goodies. A Canyon Classic commemorative shirt may be purchased for \$10 when ordered with early registration, or \$15 at the ride, but subject to availability. Tandem riders must register individually.

What you'll need to bring - Lots of enthusiasm! A bicycle (any type), patch kit, tire pump and a helmet for your safety. **Wearing bicycle helmets will be required and enforced.**



When to Register - NOW! REGISTRATION DEADLINE IS MAY 25, 2001. Same day registration will be \$5 more for each ride, and the shirts will be subject to availability. Ride goes rain or shine, no refunds. Send a stamped return envelope if you wish a confirmation.
