On behalf of YMCA of Stanislaus County, I am writing to ask that you help us mark a momentous occasion.



WHEREAS, the year 2001 marks the 150th anniversary of the YMCA movement in the United States, and marks the 82nd anniversary of YMCA of Stanislaus County, and the YMCA has touched the lives of virtually all Americans, from pioneering camping, public libraries, night schools, group swimming lessons and lifesaving, and teaching English as a second language to inventing basketball and volleyball; and,

WHEREAS, the YMCA is dedicated to building strong kids, strong families, and strong communities, and serves people of all ages, incomes and abilities through a wide variety of programs and services designed to meet changing community needs; and,

WHEREAS, YMCA of Stanislaus County lives its mission every day, "To put Christian principles into practice through programs that build healthy spirit, mind, and body for all," and the YMCA movement in the United States serves nearly 18 million members per year as an organization that is volunteer-founded, volunteer-based, and volunteer-led; and,

WHEREAS, YMCA of Stanislaus County programs provide a spirit of adventure that challenges members to learn new skills, try new activities, and explore other cultures while being good citizens in their community, and YMCA of Stanislaus County provides parents with high quality, affordable child care, teens with a safe place to go after school, leadership development programs for youth, and programs for active older adults; and,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Stanislaus County Board of Supervisors does hereby unanimously commend and congratulate YMCA of Stanislaus County for their 82 years of service in Stanislaus County, and does hereby proclaim June 2, 2001 as YMCA Day.
