DISCUSSION: The Estanislao Chapter No.58 of the Ancient and Honorable Order of E. Clampus Vitus is requesting authorization to place a historical monument in Frank Raines Regional Park to commemorate the Patterson & Western Railroad.

E. Clampus Vitus has a tradition of recognizing locations of California history, and would like to commemorate the railroad that was laid through Del Puerto Canyon and later became the base for the road from Patterson to San Jose.

In working with the Patterson Historical Society as well as the Stanislaus Historical Society on this project, the monument would commemorate the railroad that operated from September 20, 1916 until August 14, 1920. The railroad served dozens of mines to bring the much needed minerals of magnesite, manganese chrome and quick silver down the rugged canyon to the processing plant.

The placing of this monument would continue the efforts of E. Clampus Vitus to recognize locations of California history.

The Department of Parks and Recreation therefore requests the Board's approval of the staff recommendations.

POLICY

ISSUE:

The Board's authorization is needed to place historical monuments on County property. This action supports the Board's priority of achieving multi-jurisdictional cooperation.
