DISCUSSION:

The Stanislaus County Sheriff's Regional Training Division has been working with community partners to upgrade and update the physical fitness equipment at the Ray Simon Regional Criminal Justice Training Center. The Center serves eight counties in the Central Valley and provides training to hundreds of law enforcement officers.

The Simon Family Criminal Justice Foundation has agreed to donate \$16,970.13 for the purchase of physical fitness equipment including two treadmills, two elliptical trainers, two upright stationary bicycles and a heavy-duty rowing machine. The equipment will be used daily in proscribed physical training programs. Cadets at the Training Center complete an intensive physical training regimen of over 120 hours spread over 24 weeks. The current equipment is worn out and well past its useful life.

This equipment will allow current and future peace officers the ability to prepare physically and mentally, for the challenges of keeping our communities safe. It is imperative that law enforcement officers be in good physical condition to meet the rigors of the job.

POLICY ISSUES:

Acceptance and recognition of this donation supports the Board priorities of a safe community and efficient delivery of public services.


I'm requesting an appearance at the next available Board meeting in September to request on behalf of the Sheriff, your approval for the acceptance of a check in the amount of \$16,900 from the Simon Family Criminal Justice Foundation and the Simon Companies to be made available for the purchase of all new athletic and exercise equipment in the Ray Simon Criminal Justice Training Center.

We've learned that the equipment is very old and rapidly deteriorating. In order to keep this academy moving in the direction of becoming a state of the art institution for training of police and sheriff officers, it is necessary that citizens like myself participate in ensuring this possibility.

Recently, a benefit was held with innumerable sheriff officers, sheriffs, police chiefs, police officers and other State and Federal law enforcement people who were extremely impressed with the turn around in this program under Lt. Jim Gordan. These classes are now being sought by many young men throughout the state. Our Foundation recently issued \$2,000 grants to several individuals that qualified, but who could not afford to pay their fees at the academy.
