Authorized by the Rivers and Harbors Act in 1935, the CVP is one of the most ambitious Federal water storage, transfer, and delivery systems conceived and implemented in American history. Reclamation is seeking your comments on the draft nomination in compliance with the regulations at 36 CFR Part 60.4.
