FISCAL IMPACT (Continued):

Phase II grant funding for \$1,300,000 has been approved by the State for the construction phase including construction contingency, construction management, inspections, permits testing and quality insurance. The PFF funds will purchase picnic tables, benches, pedestal barbeques, American Disability Act (ADA) pathways, and other items not reimbursable by the State.

DISCUSSION:

Heron Point Development Project

In the past, the Department of Parks and Recreation has worked closely with the Department of Public Works to deliver improvements at Woodward Reservoir like the saddle dams, vaulted toilets, sewer lift station and the water well. The Department of Parks and Recreation will continue this partnership with the Department of Public Works to provide project management, engineering design, and construction oversight for the Heron Point Development Project.

The original proposed Heron Point improvements included the development of campsites in addition to the new boat ramp and other amenities. After careful consideration of customer practices and differentiating between day use and overnight camping, the Parks and Recreation Department chose to commit Heron Point to day use only activities and expand camping opportunities in the nearby areas of Muniz Point, Muir Point and Mountain View. This change broadens the planning scope of the south shore developed areas, which, once developed, would more than double the number of existing campgrounds at Woodward Reservoir Regional Park.

On April 19, 2005, the Stanislaus County Board of Supervisors authorized the Parks and Recreation Department to apply for a State of California Department of Boating and Waterways Grant to develop a new boat launch area at Heron Point in Woodward Reservoir Regional Park and authorized the use of Public Facilities Fees (PFF) in the amount of \$366,940. After applying for the grant, the State chose to modify the scope of work to provide additional parking, a fish cleaning station, security lighting, fully plumbed restroom with a sewer lift station, landscaping, accessible pathways, and an increase in project area. (Attachment A).

On August 24, 2006, the Department of Boating and Waterways Commission convened and approved Phase I grant funding for the Heron Point Launching Facility project in the amount of \$200,000. These funds would be dedicated for the development of design construction drawings and to meet environmental requirements. The Board report dated November 21, 2006 accepted the Phase I funding, established a capital project fund, and adopted a resolution with the State of California Boating and Waterways. Phase I of the grant contract was signed on December 1, 2006.

On October 3, 2007, Phase II of the Heron Point Project was presented to the Boating and Waterways Commission for approval. The remaining \$1,300,000 was granted to Stanislaus County for a total grant amount of \$1,500,000. The second phase of funding is to be used for construction costs. Staff's recommendation would allow the Department of Boating and

Waterways and the Department of Parks and Recreation to sign the amended contract agreement for \$1,500,000.

The time lapse during Phase II and the current date occurred primarily due to staff changes at the Department of Boating and Waterways and Stanislaus County Department of Parks and Recreation. On June 4, 2008, a new project manager from the Department of Boating and Waterways was assigned.

Improvements to Woodward Reservoir Regional Park

On November 16, 2004, the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) Initial Study and Negative Declaration for physical improvements at Woodward Reservoir Regional Park was completed and forwarded to the State of California Clearinghouse and Planning Unit and the Stanislaus County Environmental Review Committee (ERC) for review. The State Clearinghouse review period closed on December 17, 2004, and no State agencies submitted comments by that date. The ERC reviewed the project and provided no comments. The Department of Parks and Recreation received no challenges to the findings of the CEQA Initial Study and Negative Declaration. On July 12, 2005, the Board approved the findings of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) Initial Study and adopted the Negative Declaration for physical improvements at Woodward Reservoir Regional Park.

The Woodward Reservoir Park Improvement Projects are consistent with the Stanislaus County Parks Master Plan and is a Capital Improvement Plan eligible project. Woodward Reservoir Regional Park operations are permitted through a contract with South San Joaquin Irrigation District (SSJID). The Department met with SSJID representatives on March 11, 2005 to discuss the proposed developments. SSJID was supportive of the proposed project but indicated that approval would need to be provided from the State of California Department of Health Services (DHS). On April 4, 2005, Joe Spano, DHS representative, approved the plan for campground and boat launching facility developments at Woodward Reservoir.

POLICY ISSUE:

The Board of Supervisors should determine whether or not approval of this item would be consistent with the new Board priorities to strive for a safe community, effective partnerships and a well-planned infrastructure.

STAFFING IMPACTS:

At this time, there are no additional staffing impacts associated with this item.

WHEREAS, Stanislaus County Department of Parks and Recreation operates Heron Point boat launching facility at Woodward Reservoir Regional Park located at 14528 Twenty-Six Mile Road in Oakdale, California 95361; and

WHEREAS, Stanislaus County Department of Parks and Recreation is desirous of improving the boat launching facility at Heron Point, Woodward Reservoir Regional Park, to meet the needs of watercraft users and to provide public amenities to those utilizing the boat launching facilities; and

WHEREAS, the Department of Boating and Waterways is authorized to provide grants to cities, counties, districts, and other agencies for the construction and improvement of small craft launching area; and

WHEREAS, Stanislaus County Department of Parks and Recreation has made the determination, given the fact Stanislaus County and the State of California have the only public boat launching facilities utilized for recreation boating withing a 55-mile radius, the proposed project will not be detrimental to the operations of private boating businesses in the area; and

WHEREAS, Stanislaus County Department of Parks and Recreation has determined the proposed project to be engineering and financially feasible, and economically justified; and

WHEREAS, Stanislaus County Department of Parks and Recreation is willing to provide for the operation and maintenance of the proposed facilities at no cost to the State; and

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Stanislaus County Board of Supervisors, by adoption of this resolution, hereby requests the Department of Boating and Waterways provide a grant for the purpose of improving a public use boating launching facility at Heron Point at Woodward Reservoir Regional Park.



- "A. The Grantee waives all claims and recourse against the Department, including the right to contribution for any loss<u>es</u> or damage<u>s</u> arising from, growing out of, or <u>in</u> any way connected with or incident to this Agreement.
- B. The Grantee agrees to indemnify, defend and <u>hold</u> harmless, the Department, its officers, agents and employees from any and all claims and losses accruing or resulting to any and all contractors, subcontractors, suppliers, laborers, and any other person, firm, <u>entity</u> or corporation furnishing or supplying work services, materials, or supplies in connection with the performance of this Agreement, and/or from any and all claims and losses accruing or resulting to any person, firm, <u>entity</u> or corporation who may be injured or damaged by Grantee in the performance of this Agreement.
- C. The Grantee shall indemnify, hold harmless, and defend the Department, its officers, agents and employees against any and all claims, demands, damages, costs, expenses or liability connected with or arising out of the acquisition, design, construction, operation, maintenance, existence or failure of the project.
- D. If the Department is named as a co-defendant pursuant to Government Code section 895, et seq., the Grantee shall notify the Department and represent it unless the Department elects to represent itself. If the Department undertakes its own defense, it shall bear its own litigation costs, expenses and attorney's fees."

Save as herein or previously amended, the contract of August 28, 2006 shall remain in full force and effect.
