Approval to Adopt a Resolution of Support to the Stanislaus Council of Governments to Formally Apply for the Partnership Planning Grant 2009-2010 for the Proposed South County Corridor Project (West Main Street) to Fund the Feasibility Study with the City of Patterson and Stanislaus

### DISCUSSION:

The Department of Transportation (Caltrans) is currently accepting applications for the 2009-2010 Transportation Planning Grants. The grant funds that are available can be used for Community-Based Transportation Planning; Partnership Planning; Transit Planning; and Environmental Justice (Context-Sensitive Planning). The ultimate goal of these grants is to adopt, initiate, and program transportation improvements.

Only a Regional Transportation Planning Agency (such as the Stanislaus Council of Governments also known as StanCOG) can submit a Regional Partnership Planning Grant Application. The objective of this program is to encourage or strengthen multi-agency and/or government-to-government partnerships and the projects must have a statewide and/or regional benefit. Project types include:

- Studies that identify regional, inter-county, and/or statewide mobility and access needs;
- Corridor studies and corridor preservation studies;
- Projects evaluating transportation issues involving ground access to international borders; and
- Seaports, airports, intermodal facilities, freight hubs, and recreational sites.

With this in mind, the City of Patterson, City of Turlock, and Stanislaus County have met with StanCOG requesting their support to apply for grant money to fund a feasibility study for the South County Corridor Project. The future corridor will travel from Interstate 5 (I-5) to State Route 99 (SR-99) in Turlock. Stanislaus County and the City of Turlock have determined that West Main Street will be the corridor from SR-99 to the San Joaquin River. The feasibility study will help determine the alignment from the San Joaquin River to I-5. During these preliminary discussions, City of Patterson staff has identified a Poplar-Eucalyptus-Zacharias alignment as the best fit for existing and future general plans. Improvement of the corridor is necessary to ensure that goods and services can move efficiently and safely from the City of Patterson to SR 99.

The existing West Main Street corridor consists of a two-lane county road with a series of uncontrolled, two-, four-way stop intersections. StanCOG identified this corridor as one of the most unsafe corridors in its Regional Transportation Plan. The number of collisions along this corridor is higher than the County average. As truck traffic using the corridor increases, this could present a barrier to future commercial and industrial growth with the City of Patterson, as well as other Stanislaus County communities served by the Highway 99 corridor.

To address existing development along the route, the County proposes to prepare preliminary engineering studies, which will identify appropriate alignment and right of way needs along this corridor using Public Facility Fee Program funds. This work will include focused traffic, engineering and environmental studies. The purpose of the feasibility study is to tie together this corridor study with an evaluation of alternative alignments from the San Joaquin River to I-5.

This corridor has been in the planning stages for many years. In 1991, StanCOG adopted an expressway study that first identified this corridor as a major expressway route to serve regional and inter-regional traffic demand. In 2006, the County updated its General Plan to include the expressway corridor and the project was later adopted in the draft expenditure plan for the unsuccessful local sales tax measure, Measure S, Transportation Improvement Program. While the measure itself failed, the need for the project is not diminished. The cities and the County recognize the need for the facility and depend on the result of the planning study to help them identify the scope and cost of the project, establish a plan line for adoption by all jurisdictions so that development does not encroach on the future alignment, and develop a financial strategy that can be adopted by all involved to ensure that the corridor improvements are built.

### **POLICY ISSUES:**

The Board should consider if the recommended actions are consistent with its priorities of providing a safe community, a healthy community and a well-planned infrastructure system.
