DISCUSSION:

The week of April 26-May 2, 2009 has been designated as National Crime Victims' Rights Week for 2009 by the National Center for Victims of Crime and the Office for Victims of Crime within the United States Department of Justice. The theme is "25 Years of Rebuilding Lives: Celebrating the 'Victims of Crime Act' ". The Victim Services Program of the District Attorney's Office requests that the Board of Supervisors approve a proclamation designating these days as Victims' Rights Week in Stanislaus County.

The Victim Services Program, in conjunction with the Sund-Carrington Foundation, will be hosting the "Vigil of Hope: Victims' Rights Information Day" on April 18, 2009, in honor of victims and the upcoming Victims' Rights Week.
