Approval for Bonita Elementary School, Newman-Crows Landing Unified School District to Have Exclusive Use of Bonita Pool at Crows Landing on May 26, 2009 for their End of the Year Reading Incentive Pool Party

DISCUSSION

A request has been received from Bonita Elementary School, Newman-Crows Landing Unified School District to have exclusive use of Bonita Pool on Tuesday, May 26, 2009 from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. for their End of the Year Reading Incentive Pool Party.

This is the second year that Bonita Elementary School has requested the use of the Bonita Pool at Crows Landing for its annual event.

The Department of Parks and Recreation does not have any objections to this request for exclusive use and as such necessitates the Bonita Elementary School, Newman-Crows Landing Unified School District to adhere to the following requirements:

- By Thursday, May 21, 2009, no later than 5:00 p.m. require Bonita Elementary School, Newman-Crows Landing Unified School District, to provide the Department of Parks and Recreation a Certificate of Insurance with a minimum general liability of \$1 million and endorsement naming Stanislaus County as an additional insured.
- A Hold Harmless (Organization) is required. The original agreement must be completed and returned by Thursday, May 21, 2009, no later than 5:00 p.m.
- Hold Harmless (Individuals) are required for each student and signed by a parent or guardian. The original agreements will be picked-up by a Parks and Recreation staff member on Wednesday, May 27, 2009.
- A Parks and Recreation staff member will bring the key to Bonita Pool at Crows Landing on Friday May 22, 2009, for elementary school staff set-up. On Wednesday, May 27, 2009, a Parks and Recreation staff member will pick up the key from the elementary school.
- The expected number of participants for this event is 155 students.
- No alcohol may be sold or served during this exclusive use.
- All lifeguarding services are at the expense of Bonita Elementary School, Newman-Crows Landing Unified School District and any lifeguard must be currently Lifeguard Certified.
- The area is to be left in a clean condition.

POLICY ISSUE (S)
