DISCUSSION:

The Stanislaus County Equal Rights Commission is asking the Board of Supervisors to approve the week of September 27, 2009 through October 3, 2009 as Diversity Awareness Week in Stanislaus County. This is the sixth year the County has celebrated diversity in conjunction with other local activities and the Commission would appreciate the Board formally recognizing this week. Departments throughout the County have organized activities and displays acknowledging and increasing awareness of the various diverse cultures that make our County a wonderful place to live. These Countywide events will also help us to educate both our employees and the public. At 10th Street Place, the City of Modesto and Stanislaus County have partnered together to celebrate cultures representing the world with the theme "Embrace Diversity...Embrace the World!" The countries being represented this year at 10th Street Place on various floors will be Argentina, Japan, Canada, India, and Mexico. The Community Services Agency is planning a Cultural Heritage Celebration on Tuesday September 29th, 2009, from 2pm to 4:30pm. The countries being displayed this year are United States, England, Mexico, Cambodia, Japan, Assyria, Ireland, Scotland, Portugal, Greece, Israel, Russia, Jamaica, and India with popular travel sites being highlighted for each country. The Health Services Agency will celebrate the theme "Harvest of Heritages," and will be utilizing their Intranet site to share information about various cultures. Recipes and quizzes about various cultures will be shared, and the department will host a culturally diverse food potluck. The Library will be presenting a book display about diversity. The District Attorney's office will be celebrating the country of Mexico with a potluck of various food dishes brought in by employees.

Creating public awareness of the diversity of cultures in Stanislaus County addresses the Board's priorities of effective partnerships as well as strong agricultural economy/heritage.
