potentially increase by approximately \$180,000 for the fiscal year 2009-2010. If approved the increase in fee will be effective 30 days after adoption of the ordinance.

DISCUSSION:

On October 11, 2009 California Governor Schwarzenegger signed Senate Bill 676 which authorized increases in a variety of fees charged by local governments. One provision of this bill resulted in a significant change to Government Code Section 27361 (a). This section of the code specifies the fee that can be charged for the recording and indexing of the first page of every instrument, paper or notice required or permitted by law to be recorded in the County Clerk Recorder Department. Prior to the passage of this recent bill, the base fee for recording the first page of a document was \$4.00. This fee was established in 1985 and has remained unchanged for the past 25 years.

Government Code 27361 (a) now authorizes the base fee not to exceed \$10.00 for recording and indexing the first page "to reimburse the county for the costs of services rendered..." The County Recorder's Association of California has interpreted this to mean that a fee study to determine the actual first page cost incurred by a county to perform the recording process should be performed. The Stanislaus County Clerk Recorder Department conducted a fee study to determine the actual cost incurred by the County to perform recording and indexing, which is attached as Attachment "A". The actual cost of recording and indexing the first page of a document in Stanislaus County has been determined to be \$13.31. Therefore, the Clerk Recorder's Department has prepared this proposal for fee increase. This proposal has been shared with the public through discussions with title companies and customers. Input obtained through this review process was considered during the study and is reflected in this proposal.

The following chart is based upon the of eight comparison counties. Each county was contacted and information gathered regarding new fee, date of time study, and effective date of new fee.

Based upon the Stanislaus County fee study and the county comparison study the Clerk Recorder is recommending an increase of the fee for recording the first page of a document from \$4 to \$10.

POLICY ISSUES:

An ordinance of the Board of Supervisors is required to increase or establish fees of the Clerk Recorder Department. This item meets the legal requirements for setting a public hearing to consider establishing new fees of the Department and the Board of Supervisor's priority of Efficient delivery of public services.

STAFFING IMPACT:

The collection of the fee will not result in an increase in workload for the Clerk Recorder staff.

SERVICE AND FEE SURVEY

Analysis of County Recorder staff costs: Calculation of productive hours

"Productive Hours" are those hours that a worker is considered to actually be "on the job" in the work place. Employees do not work non-stop for eight hours a day, five days a week, 52 weeks a year. The law allows for employees to have holidays, vacation time, sick leave off work and daily break time. Productive hours are used for the calculations in this report, taking into account vacation time, sick leave, legal holidays and daily break time.

Cumulative totals of average vacation taken by the County Clerk Recorder using 2008-2009 most recently available fiscal year totals are calculated as being 123 hours per year plus legal holidays which are calculated at 84 hours per year. The estimated average amount of time that employees take for sick leave is calculated at 90 hours per year. Two 15 minute breaks per day of work is calculated at 113 hours per year.

On the basis of these averages, an employee is away from his/her work 410 hours each year. The maximum potential of 2,080 full time working hours is equivalent to 1,670 actual productive hours per person per year.

County Indirect and Overhead Costs

The costs to be considered for the Stanislaus County Clerk Recorder service should include the County's overhead costs, which are calculated on an annual basis by the Stanislaus County Auditor Controller. The process includes the annual A87 "cost allocation plan". The Auditor Controller has calculated an overhead and indirect cost to be allowed as a percentage of the direct wages and benefit costs. For the 2009-2010 Fiscal Year, the Auditor Controller has identified a seventeen percentage (17%) factor of the staff salary costs.

The following table includes the calculations that were used to determine the average salary cost per productive hour including benefits and the County indirect and overhead costs in the Stanislaus County Clerk Recorder Department for Fiscal Year 2009-2010:
