

ANIMAL ADVISORY BOARD

The Stanislaus County Board of Supervisors created the Animal Advisory Board (AAB) in 1991 by adopting Resolution 91-1344. The purpose of the AAB is to:

A. Advise the Board of Supervisors and County staff on issues related to the general provision and delivery of animal care, well-being, and control in Stanislaus County.

B. Hold public hearings and workshops to provide the public with information and address community concerns relating to animal care, well-being and control.

The AAB consists of nine members. Five members represent each district in the county and four members are "Members At-Large". The AAB works with the Department of Animal Services, the Chief Executive Office, rescue and humane groups, veterinarians, kennel owner/operators, trainers and members of the community.
