Dear Community Member:

The purpose of this letter is to inform you about an environmental investigation (referred to as a Remedial Investigation or RI) that will be conducted at current and former dry cleaners in Modesto, and, most importantly to request your participation in completing the attached Community Survey. The formal name of this project is the Modesto Groundwater Investigation.

Along with this letter and survey, we've provided a fact sheet describing such information as the location of the dry cleaner sites, the reason for conducting the investigation, and a description of the contaminants of concern.

Environmental Investigations Are Being Conducted At Former and Current Modesto Dry Cleaners

Why Did I Receive This Fact Sheet?

This fact sheet has been developed to let you know about activitites being performed at former and current dry cleaners in the City of Modesto. The Department of Toxic Substances Control (DTSC) and the City of Modesto Redevelopment Agency (MRA) are working together performing environmental investigations on soil, soil gas, and groundwater at the following locations:



Who is Conducting The Site Investigation?

DTSC and the MRA signed a Voluntary Cleanup Agreement which states that the MRA will pay for the environmental investigations at the Sites. DTSC is the regulatory agency overseeing the activities to ensure that they are done in a way that is protective of human health and the environment. MRA's consultant, GeoTrans,Inc., is conducting the investigations.

How Did The Site Get Contaminated?

In the past, dry cleaners used solvents in their cleaning processes. It was common for them to spill solvents on the ground during transfer to dry cleaning machines. Dry cleaners also discharged wastewater containing solvents down the drain.


Today the rules for handling and disposing of solvents are more stringent and are considerate of human health and the environment. Dry cleaners have a legal obligation to properly use and dispose of any and all chemicals used in the dry cleaning process.

Unfortunately, however, improper use and disposal resulted in contamination of soil, soil gas, and groundwater.

In early 2002, the City of Modesto started takings soil, soil gas and groundwater samples at some former and current dry cleaner locations. Results from the samples taken found Tetrachloroethylene (PCE) contamination.

What is PCE?

PCE is a manufactured chemical that is widely used for dry cleaning of fabrics and for metal-degreasing. It is also used to make other chemicals and is used in some consumer products. It is a nonflammable liquid at room temperature. It evaporates easily into the air and has a sharp, sweet odor. At high doses and/or under prolonged exposure, PCE may irritate the skin and eyes, cause liver damage, and is known to cause cancer in animals.



Why Are The Investigations Being Conducted Now? Before the MRA can move forward with redevelopment within the redevelopment areas (please see map on Page 1) contamination concerns must be addressed.

The first step is to determine the amount and extent of contamination. The results of the investigations being conducted now will be evaluated along with existing data to develop a cleanup strategy for each individual Site sometime in the near future.

What Does The Investigation Consist Of?

- ♦Installing groundwater monitoring wells.
- ♦Establishing permanent vapor monitoring locations for collecting soil gas samples. Soil gas is the vapor that exists between soil particles. These vapors can contain contamination.
- ◆Performing Active Soil Gas Surveys at multiple depths per boring location. Active Soil Gas Surveys are used as a screening tool to determine how much and what kind of contamination exists in soil.

♦Collecting soil, soil gas, and groundwater samples to determine if possible vapor intrusion is occurring at any of the Sites.

What is Vapor Intrusion?

Vapor intrusion occurs when contamination in soil, soil gas, or groundwater volatizes and enters overlying buildings as a gas, creating indoor air quality problems and potential health risks to occupants or employees. The seepage of harmful vapors can enter buildings through cracks or openings in foundations such as conduits.

What Happens After The Investigation is Done?

The MRA will take the data collected and use it together with previously collected data to identify source areas with concentrations of PCE that pose an unacceptable risk to human health or the environment. Once these areas are identified, potential cleanup alternatives will be developed.

It's important to note that the processes mentioned above can take time. This fact sheet pertains to the investigation phase of the project. Fliers and/or fact sheets like this one will be used throughout the life of the project to update and inform the community about activities at the Sites.


