#### **DISCUSSION:**

The Sheriff's Department continues to review business practices to achieve efficiencies and eliminate redundancies. This past year, the Department reviewed various programs where fees are charged for the services. For many of the items fees had not been formally established and evolved over time as statutes changed.

As the County faces unprecedented fiscal challenges, it is important to continue to review processes and recover costs where appropriate. The following fees were reviewed this year:

- 1) Carry Concealed Weapon (CCW) Permit
- 2) Livescan/Fingerprint

#### Carry Concealed Weapon (CCW)

Pursuant to Penal Code 12050 the Sheriff has the discretion to authorize the issuance of a Carry Concealed Weapon (CCW) permit to residents of Stanislaus County. The Sheriff's Department has seen an increase in applications over the past 4 years.

The following chart is a comparison of CCW fees for nine counties. Each county was contacted and information gathered regarding fees. The fee listed below does not include the Department of Justice (DOJ) fee of \$76 and the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) fee of \$19.

The Sheriff's Department conducts a background investigation on every applicant, new and renewal, to ensure the individual meets the criteria set forth in the Penal Code. Department staff did a full review of the time it takes to process new and renewal applications. The cost to process a CCW application is detailed below.

The current fee of \$13 for a new application and \$6.50 for a renewal does not cover actual costs to issue a CCW. Staffing costs to process a new application is \$229.12 and to process a renewal application is \$120.37. Penal Code section 12054 limits the fee of processing applications to not exceed \$100.00 for a new application and \$25.00 for a renewal.

Based on this Penal Code section 12054, the Sheriff's Department recommends the fees be established at \$100 for a new application and \$25 for a renewal (see Exhibit A). Please note that this is a reduction from the \$115 and \$60 recommended in the March 16, 2010 agenda item setting the Public Hearing. This will allow the Department to recover approximately one-third of the actual cost to process applications. This level of increase is a first step toward cost recovery in this difficult economy. In addition, the Department of Justice (DOJ) and the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) levy their own fees, which the Sheriff's Department is responsible for collecting.

At the current rates, an estimated \$4,200 per year is collected. The actual cost of processing the 414 applications was approximately \$75,000. The proposed fee structure would partially recover approximately one-third of the cost. Actual revenue is difficult to project as it is anticipated that the number of applications will decrease with the new fee structure.

#### **FEE AUTHORITY:**

Penal Code Section 12054(a): "Each applicant for a new license or for the renewal of a license shall pay at the time of filing his or her application a fee determined by the Department of Justice not to exceed the application processing costs of the Department of Justice for the direct costs of furnishing the report required by Section 12052. After the department establishes fees sufficient to reimburse the department for processing costs, fees charged shall increase at a rate not to exceed the legislatively approved annual cost-of-living adjustments for the department's budget. The officer receiving the application and the fee shall transmit the fee, with the fingerprints if required, to the Department of Justice. The licensing authority of any city, city and county, or county may charge an additional fee in an amount equal to the actual costs for processing the application for a new license, excluding fingerprint and training costs, but in no case to exceed one hundred dollars (\$100)......"

### Livescan/Fingerprint

Over the past 10 years there has been a marked increase in the number of employers and agencies requiring members of the general public to be fingerprinted. These range from initial employment applications, to licensure, to work with children in schools and churches. The Sheriff's Department processes fingerprints for the public. In 2009 the Department submitted an average of 145 sets of prints per month to DOJ. These fingerprints are done on Livescan machines connected with the Department of Justice. Fingerprints are "rolled" onto a computer scanner and transmitted electronically. This requires trained staff to roll a complete set of prints. Each set takes approximately 20 minutes to input, roll and submit. Review and dissemination of the DOJ responses takes a Reserve Custodial Deputy in the Background Unit approximately 6 hours per month. Final reconciliation of the invoice from DOJ requires 8 hours per month of an Account Clerk's time.

The current \$10.00 fee does not cover the actual processing cost. The Sheriff's Department recommends setting the Livescan fee at \$15.00 per transaction, excluding DOJ and FBI fees which vary based on the type of inquiry (see Exhibit A). This \$5 increase will generate approximately \$8,700 in revenue to partially offset the cost of processing the Live Scan.

#### **FEE AUTHORITY:**

#### General Fee Authority

Government Code 54985. (a) Notwithstanding any other provision of law that prescribes an amount or otherwise limits the amount of a fee or charge that may be levied by a county, a county service area, or a county waterworks district governed by a county board of supervisors, a county board of supervisors shall have the authority to increase or decrease the fee or charge, that is otherwise authorized to be levied by another provision of law, in the amount reasonably necessary to recover the cost of providing any product or service or the cost of enforcing any regulation for which the fee or charge is levied. The fee or charge may reflect the average cost of providing any product or service or enforcing any regulation. Indirect costs that may be reflected in the cost of providing any product or service or the cost of enforcing any regulation shall be limited to those items that are included in the federal Office of Management and Budget Circular A-87 on January 1, 1984.
