This is the 27th Annual Report prepared by the Airport Advisory Committee, and covers activities from January 1 to December 31, 2009.

The Committee's regular meetings are usually scheduled on the third Wednesday of each month. All meeting agendas were posted and the meetings were open to the public. The Airport Advisory Committee met nine times during 2009; all meetings were considered official, as a quorum was present at each. Rev. Joseph Trevena was the Committee Chair for the entire year, with Kevin Young serving as Vice Chair. Keith Howes, representing the City of Ceres, resigned his AAC appointment on June 9, 2009. Bryan Briggs was subsequently appointed to this position for a four-year term on August 10, 2009. Vacant positions for the City of Turlock (Public at Large) and City of Modesto (Service Provider/General Aviation) have remained vacant throughout 2009. A roster of current 2010 Airport Advisory Committee members is attached to this report

Airport highlights from 2009 are noted below:

Chamber of Commerce Mixer at the Airport

On the evening of March 19, 2009 the Airport hosted an estimated 200-250 Chamber members and guests who attended a Chamber Mixer, the first time for this type of public outreach event at Modesto Airport. The Commemorative Air Force assisted with set-up and displays in their historic Hangar #1 and aircraft displays were staged on the ramp outside; Sky Trek Aviation hosted the bar and refreshments were provided by the airport. Local travel agencies and several other businesses had exhibits and distributed information. SkyWest Airline was represented by Ms. Brandi Honey who flew in from St. George, Utah to attend. A good time was had by all, and the public left with an increased awareness of what Modesto Airport has to offer to our citizens.

Airport Appreciation Day:

The Committee endorsed the use of the airport in support of Airport Appreciation Day. which was held on Saturday, May 16, 2009. Over 1,000 people attended the day's festivities, organized by the Commemorative Air Force (CAF) with assistance by Modesto Area Pilots Association (MAPA). The theme of the event was A Tribute to Our Armed Forces, complete with aircraft fly-overs and military and civilian aircraft on display, in addition to a military color guard and dedications to the Honor Wall for local veterans of war. Visitors also enjoyed seeing equipment from Police, Fire and AMR ambulance, as well as classic car displays, radio controlled model plane demonstrations, kiddy rides, airplane and helicopter rides, a food court, souvenirs and raffles.

Passenger Services:

In 2009 MOD had 26,783 passengers flying from Modesto to San Francisco International Airport (SFO) on the five round-trip daily flights provided by SkyWest Airline. In an attempt to garner additional airline service, the airport applied for a federally funded Small Communities Air Service Development Program grant in May 2009. It was through the award of this same grant in 2005 that Modesto was able to attract LAX flights.

Part 150 Noise Compatibility Study

The 2007 Aircraft Noise Study, a proactive local planning effort, is nearing completion. Final approval by the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) is anticipated in June 2010.

County Revenue from Aircraft Possessory Taxes:

The airport receives 1/3 of aircraft taxes received from aircraft "based" at MOD. Those revenues are used for airport operating expenses. In addition to the airport's 1/3, a separate check for \$198,420, representing the County's 1/3 of airport property taxes, was given to the airport in March 2009. These County funds are dedicated for use on General Aviation capital improvements at the airport. The funds deposited in this separate, interest-bearing account have been committed for several years to the development of a new ten-plex row of aircraft storage T-hangars which will provide new homes for more aircraft, leading to increased aircraft tax revenues, additional fuel sales and business for airport based maintenance operations, all of which benefit the airport and our community.

New Aircraft Storage T-hangars:

After several years of financial planning and preparation, a ground-breaking ceremony was held on May 27, 2009 for construction of a new ten-unit T-hangar. Construction of the new T-hangars was complete and was being forwarded to City Council for final approval in February 2010.

Airport Rates and Fees Adjustments:

The airport did not increase rates and fees for General Aviation facilities in 2009. An adjustment was made to aircraft landing fees, going from \$0.68 to \$0.88 per thousand pounds of gross weight, which is still far below the rate charged by comparable airports for commercial or revenue producing flights.

Flight School Changes:

In January 2009 Modesto Flight School, Inc. (MFC), the sole provider of pilot instruction and training, abruptly discontinued operations at Modesto. After review of proposals submitted in response to a Request for Proposals, Modesto Aviation, Inc. was chosen to provide flight instruction and other general aviation services at Modesto Airport Opening their doors on August 18, 2009, Modesto Aviation has become a very welcome addition to the airport, providing discovery flights, flight training, and sale of pilot supplies, as well as aircraft rentals, maintenance and management.

Forward Looking:

Identified as significant to the airport's future, the following projects are on the agenda for 2010:

- Complete airline terminal complex expansion study
- Irrigation and landscape improvements
- Airport Layout Plan update and Program Narrative Summary (5-year development plan)
- Obtain new Aircraft Rescue Fire Fighting vehicle to replace a mid-1960's fire truck
- Pursue new revenue sources and customer service opportunities for development
- Harrah's resort, Laughlin, NV leisure charter flights coming in 2010!

This report is a summary of activities involving the Airport Advisory Committee during 2009.
