SUBJECT:

Approval to Submit an Application to the California Department of Public Health, Office of Family Planning, for the Teen Pregnancy Prevention Information & Education Grant Program funding, and to Enter the Grant Agreement upon Award

STAFF RECOMMENDATIONS:

1. Approve the submission of an application for funding to the California Department of Public Health, Office of Family Planning, for the Teen Pregnancy Prevention Information & Education (I & E) Program (Request for Application RFA 11-10017) for the period beginning July 1, 2011 and ending June 30, 2016.
2. Authorize the Health Services Agency Managing Director or her designee to sign the agreement, and any amendments thereafter, and accept the funds, if awarded.

FISCAL IMPACT:

The term of the Teen Pregnancy Prevention Information & Education grant is from July 1, 2011 through June 30, 2016. Awards will be determined through a competitive application process. Based upon geographic location, grant awards are anticipated to be between \$50,000 - \$100,000. Specifically, funding preference and funding level will be determined by identifying applicants serving clients in a Medical Service Study Area (MSSA) with high teen birth rates. Based upon these criteria the Health Services

**FISCAL IMPACT (Continued):**

Agency (HSA) is eligible to apply for \$100,000 per fiscal year. If the grant is awarded, the Health Services Agency will include the revenue and expenditures in its Fiscal Year 2011-2012 Proposed Budget submission.

**DISCUSSION:**

The California Department of Public Health Office of Family Planning has issued a Request for Application (RFA) for the Information & Education Grant Program, to solicit applications to fund community-based and community driven programs that address the problems of teen and unintended pregnancy through prevention and health education activities, along with linkages to family planning services and reproductive health care.

The Office of Family Planning (OFP) is a division within the Center for Family Health, California Department of Public Health (CDPH). The OFP is charged by the California Legislature *"to make available to citizens of the State of California who are of childbearing age, comprehensive medical knowledge, assistance, and services relating to the planning of families."* The Information & Education Program is authorized by California Welfare and Institutions Code Section 14504.3 (a-e) and Title XIX of the Federal Social Security Act (Medicaid) administered under the Teen Pregnancy Prevention (TPP) Program.

The goal of the Information & Education Program is:

- To decrease teenage pregnancy through educational programs to equip teens at high risk for pregnancy with the knowledge, understanding, and behavioral skills necessary to make responsible decisions regarding at-risk behavior.

The target populations for the Information & Education Program include the following:

- Youth in schools, juvenile justice facilities, community-based settings, social services and youth agencies, and foster care programs.
- Pregnant and parenting teens
- Parents of high-risk youths and other adults responsible for serving youths such as teachers, counselors, and social service workers

Health Services Agency (HSA) has been the leader in the community in addressing issues pertaining to adolescent pregnancy for the past 20 years. The Information and Education Grant has been in place within HSA since May of 1997 and funding has been maintained through each of its funding cycles, totaling approximately \$1.4 million. In the current 2010-2011 Fiscal Year, HSA is receiving \$67,000 in grant funding. This new RFA has increased yearly funding by \$33,000. Through the years, HSA has provided both school and community based education on sexual health for

thousands of County residents. For example, in 2009 approximately 3,000 high school students received comprehensive sexual health education within Stanislaus County.

The Health Services Agency's Information & Education Program for 2011–2016 will propose to concentrate its efforts on high risk youth in and out of school, between the ages of 12-17, as well as mainstream youth in the school. The primary objective is to have a sphere of influence in reducing teen pregnancies, repeat pregnancies, sexually transmitted infections, and supporting students who have chosen to abstain from sexual activities.

The proposed programs will be delivered to adolescents and parents in high schools, alternative schools, Foster Care programs and community-based organizations. These programs will serve approximately 2,000 youth and parents annually in Stanislaus County.

**POLICY ISSUES:**

The Board of Supervisors' approval of the application for and acceptance of the Teen Pregnancy Prevention Information & Education grant award meets with the Board's priorities of A Healthy Community and Effective Partnerships, as it will enable the Health Services Agency to continue to work with local schools and the community to continue efforts in preventing teen and unintended pregnancies.

**STAFFING IMPACT:**

There is no staffing impact associated with this request. The current Information & Education Program funds 1.25 full time positions. A successful application will continue to provide funding for this staffing.
