San Joaquin River Restoration Draft Program Document Available and Public Hearings Scheduled

The Bureau of Reclamation and the California Department of Water Resources (DWR) are holding four public hearings to solicit input on the Draft Program Environmental Impact Statement/Environmental Impact Report (Draft PEIS/R) for the San Joaquin River Restoration Program (SJRRP). The draft document was released for public review and comment on April 22 and a **60-day public comment period runs through close of business Tuesday, June 21, 2011.**
