STAFF RECOMMENDATIONS:

- 1. Authorize the Director of the Parks and Recreation Department, or her designee, to accept donations of labor, materials, equipment and design work from Jon E. Maring and Group to renovate Laird Park located in the Grayson/Westley Area.
- 2. Authorize the Director of Parks and Recreation, or her designee, to sign all necessary documents for the completion of the Laird Park Renovation Project.

FISCAL IMPACT:

Renovation, reconstruction and maintenance of Laird Park will be provided by Jon E. Maring and Group, with no additional matching funds required from Stanislaus County. The estimated value of the renovation and reconstruction of Laird Park is in excess of \$100,000.

Approval to Accept the Donations from Jon E. Maring and Group for the Laird Park Renovation Project Located in the Grayson/Westley Area

DISCUSSION:

Laird Park is a place where previously, families came to have picnics, kids played ball, and community events were held. In the past, this park facility offered a built-in barbeque, picnic tables, shade shelter, baseball diamond, and restrooms. This facility also offers several access points along the river for fishing. In Fiscal Year (FY) 2009-2010, the maintenance of the facility was turned over to the Parks and Recreation Department. By that time, due to lack of funding for maintenance and upkeep, the restrooms and irrigation system had deteriorated beyond repair. In FY 2009-2010, the Parks and Recreation Department received \$22,000 for the maintenance of the facility. Since then, the amount of funding has decreased and in FY 2011-2012, the Department received approximately \$10,780. In addition, over the last ten years, full-time Parks and Recreation staff has decreased from 39 positions to 20. Without adequate funding, the only maintenance the Department could provide was fire prevention and minimal litter pick-up.

During July of 2011, the Board of Supervisors was approached by a group of private citizens, including Jon E. Maring, about restoring and maintaining Laird Park. Collectively, it is referred to herein as the "Group." This Group has submitted a renovation plan (Attachment A) that includes the following tasks:

- 1) Tree removal including the grinding and removal of the tree material;
- 2) Pruning the remaining trees;
- 3) Installation of a new irrigation well;
- 4) Design, and install a new irrigation system;
- 5) Area preparation for the new irrigation system;
- 6) Supply and maintain portable restrooms; and
- 7) Assistance with maintenance and management of the park.

The project area includes approximately 30 acres of previously developed parkland. The description of the project area is south of Grayson Road and bounded by the Laird Park access road to the south and west, and the chain link fence to the east (Attachment B). This is a request to renovate and reconstruct the infrastructure that previously deteriorated at Laird Park. This proposal includes the design and replacement of the existing irrigation system, and ground preparation of the area where the new system will be installed. The proposal also includes providing and maintaining portable restrooms, the turf area, and the pruning and/or removal of some of the trees that pose a safety hazard, which includes the mulberry trees. Removal of the mulberry trees may come at a later date and would reduce the expensive annual maintenance of these trees. The Laird Park Renovation Project will start after the harvest season and should be complete by late summer 2012.

Each of the entities in the Group will be required to complete a form prepared by the Office of County Counsel. This form will limit the County's liability and ensure that these entities will not retain any vested interest in any of the property and renovations by virtue of their donation. (Attachment C)

On September 8, 2011, this project was presented and reviewed by the Stanislaus County Parks and Recreation Commission. In discussion, the Commission found that the project is

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consistent with the Parks Master Plan adopted August 24, 1999. This project is exempt from CEQA under Section 15302 Replacement or Reconstruction.

This is the third park renovation by a private party to be brought before the Board of Supervisors. The two previous projects approved and completed by volunteer groups were the Modesto Rotary Club at Oregon Park and the Salida Rotary Club at Broadway Park. This generous donation has come at a very good time since the budget for the Parks and Recreation Department has been reduced so much that only a minimum of maintenance could be provided to Laird Park. The Department will work with this group to help support the maintenance of the park to the extent funding is available.

The Laird Park Renovation Project will provide much needed open park space for families and communities to gather. In addition, it will be a source of pride for the west side communities.

POLICY ISSUE:

Approval of staff's recommendation supports the Board's priorities of A Well Planned Infrastructure System and Effective Partnerships by partnering with community members to provide a special opportunity within Stanislaus County.

STAFFING IMPACTS:

Department staff will work with the Group, volunteer groups and Alternative Work Program (AWP) to provide maintenance of Laird Park.

The undersigned further agrees to pay any and all costs and expenses, including but not limited to court costs and reasonable attorneys' fees, incurred by the County on account of any such claims, demands, or liabilities.

The undersigned further agrees that acceptance of the donations of labor, materials, equipment and design work by the Stanislaus County Board of Supervisors creates no rights, interests, licenses (revocable or irrevocable), easements (express, implied, or by estoppel) or covenants that are personal or that run with the land by the persons or entities or their agents and/or employees who made the donation, to or in the park, land, well, or water rights connected to the well. It is further agreed that the undersigned intends the donation of labor, materials, equipment, and design work to the County in favor of public use and that the undersigned retains no interest in or creates no rights to continue to manage or maintain the donated time, material, labor, or design work upon completion of the project. It is expressly understood there is no agreement or ongoing commitment by the County to maintain the park in the same condition as it will be upon completion of the project should funds be unavailable to further maintain the park.
