Approval to Adopt Plans and Specifications for the Stanislaus County 2012 Chip Seal Program (Asphalt Rejuvenation Emulsion) and Set the Bid Opening Date

STAFF RECOMMENDATIONS:

1. Adopt the Plans and Specifications for the Stanislaus County 2012 Chip Seal Program (Asphalt Rejuvenation Emulsion).
2. Direct the Department of Public Works to set the bid opening date and time.
3. Direct the Department of Public Works to publish and mail the notice inviting bids for the project as required by law.

FISCAL IMPACT:

The total anticipated cost for this project is \$1,000,000 that includes \$750,000 for the emulsion and \$250,000 for trucking and rock chips. The project will be funded 100% by Proposition 1B roads funds. Funding for the emulsion will be included in Budget Year 2012-2013 Road Operations budget, with the contract to be awarded after July 1, 2012. Funding for trucking and rock chips is available in the current year's Road Operations budget.

Approval to Adopt Plans and Specifications for the Stanislaus County 2012 Chip Seal Program (Asphalt Rejuvenation Emulsion) and Set the Bid Opening Date

DISCUSSION:

The Stanislaus County 2012 Chip Seal Program (Asphalt Rejuvenation Emulsion) consists of sealing existing County roadways with polymer asphalt rejuvenating emulsion and the placement of rock chips on the emulsion. The emulsion will seal cracks in the road and prevent moisture from seeping under the pavement. The rock chips will improve the skid resistance and driving surface of the road.

The invitation to bid is for the asphalt rejuvenating emulsion only. Department of Public Works Road Operations crews will provide the labor and have begun the stockpiling of rock chips.

The Stanislaus County 2012 Chip Seal Program (Asphalt Rejuvenation Emulsion) is a preventive maintenance step. These roads are low and medium volume roads that chip seal can protect. Constituent complaints were also a consideration for inclusion on the list of selected roads. Chip Seal is anticipated to add up to 10 years to the life of the road. The following roads are included in the program:

- Hammett Road (Hammett Court to Beckwith Road)
- Ciccarelli Road (Hammett Road to Toomes Road)
- Kiernan Avenue (Toomes Road to Hammett Road)
- Covert Road (Jackson Road to Toomes Road)
- Bacon Road (Toomes Road to Gates Road)
- Gates Road (Bacon Road to Hwy 132)
- Jackson Road (Beckwith Road to Kiernan Avenue)
- Hall Road (Kiernan Avenue to End of the Road)
- Williams Road (Kiernan Avenue to Bacon Road)
- Yribarren Road (Bacon Road to End of the Road)
- Kiernan Avenue (Hammett Road to Williams Road)
- Kiernan Avenue (Williams Road to Jackson Road)
- Rosemore Avenue (Blue Gum Avenue to Hwy 132)
- Hemlock Avenue (Laurel Avenue to Industrial Way)

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- Spruce Avenue (Laurel Avenue to Industrial Way)
- Larch Avenue (Laurel Avenue to Industrial Way)
- Tamarack Avenue (Laurel Avenue to Industrial Way)
- Collins Road (Laurel Avenue to Industrial Way)
- Moffet Road (Don Pedro Road to Service Road)
- Don Pedro Road (Collins Road to Moffet Road)

This project is tentatively scheduled to begin August 9, 2012, and end September 10, 2012.

This project is exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act, Class 1, California Code of Regulations, Title 14, §15301 (Existing Facilities). A Notice of Exemption was filed with the County Clerk-Recorder on March 27, 2012.
