SUBJECT:

Approval to Declare Vehicles and Heavy Equipment as Surplus and Authorize the Sale

STAFF RECOMMENDATIONS:

1. Declare the attached list of County vehicles and heavy equipment as surplus and authorize the sale.
2. Direct the Auditor/Controller to deposit proceeds from the sale to the Department of Public Works, account 5121-0042100-46000.

FISCAL IMPACT:

It is unknown, at this time, what the proceeds of the sale of the vehicles and equipment will be. The estimated value of the vehicles and heavy equipment is \$65,000. Public Works will work with the General Services Agency - Purchasing Division through multiple methods of sale to maximize the funds returned to the County, including County surplus sale, advertising on government web sites and ultimately release to auction. All proceeds from the sale of vehicles and heavy equipment will be deposited to the County Treasury for use by the Department of Public Works.

DISCUSSION:

Due to changing regulations with the California Air Resources Board, the attached list of vehicles and heavy equipment has been retired from Public Works in order to meet compliance. It is recommended that the Board approve this request to declare as surplus, the attached list of vehicles and heavy equipment, and authorize the sale.

County Ordinance 2.24.065 allows for the sale of surplus property with a residual value greater than one thousand dollars upon approval by the Board of Supervisors.

2.24.065 Sale of personal property.

The purchasing agent is authorized to sell, trade, trade in, lease, exchange, or otherwise dispose of any personal property belonging to the county which is deemed to be surplus and not required for public use by the county and which has a value of less than one thousand dollars per individual item without prior approval by the board of supervisors. Notwithstanding any other provision of this code, such disposition of surplus property may be made without securing bids or advertising. For disposition of personal property exceeding one thousand dollars per individual item, prior approval from the board of supervisors must be obtained. All proceeds from such sales shall be paid into the county treasury for the use of the county. (Ord. CS 475 §3, 1992).

All vehicles and heavy equipment have been fully depreciated effective February 2012. The cost to retrofit the equipment on the attached list exceeds the value. The entire list of vehicles and heavy equipment has out lived their usefulness and are no longer of use to any County department. Therefore, the request is being made to sell all the items on the attached spreadsheet in one of three ways:

- Release to auction company; or
- Sale on government website; or
- County surplus sale.

There will be no cost to the County to sell either by auctioneer or government website, the entire cost is borne by the buyer. The net proceeds from the sell of vehicles and heavy equipment will return to the Department of Public Works – Morgan Shop Division.

Approval to Declare Vehicles and Heavy Equipment from the Department of
Public Works as Surplus and Authorize the Sale
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Department of Public Works is requesting that the proceeds of the auction, estimated at \$65,000 be directed to the Department of Public Works, account #5121-42100-46000.

A County surplus sale would require the selling department to encounter a small fee such as, placing an ad in the local paper or other miscellaneous fees if necessary, which will be offset by the revenue from the sale.

POLICY ISSUES:

The sale of retired vehicles and heavy equipment is consistent with the Board of Supervisors' priority of Efficient Delivery of Public Services by disposing of vehicles and heavy equipment no longer in use.

STAFFING IMPACT:

There is no staffing impact associated with this recommendation.
