SUBJECT:

Approval to Declare Cisco Catalyst Network Switching Equipment from the Health Services Agency as Surplus and Authorize the Sale

STAFF RECOMMENDATIONS:

1. Declare the Health Services Agency Cisco catalyst network switching equipment as surplus and authorize its public sale.
2. Direct the Auditor-Controller to deposit net receipts from the sale of these assets, in such Health Services Agency fund/orgs as appropriate to the fixed asset location in Oracle.

FISCAL IMPACT:

The fiscal impact of selling the attached list of fully-depreciated Health Services Agency network equipment will not be known until after the equipment has been auctioned or placed for sale, but is estimated to be \$1,200. The net proceeds from the sale of equipment will be deposited to the County Treasury for use by the Health Services Agency.

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DISCUSSION:

In Fiscal Year 2002–2003, Stanislaus County Health Services Agency (HSA) purchased network switching equipment from Cisco to improve telecommunications within HSA, as part of the Telecommunications Strategy at a cost of \$124,431.78. The equipment was fully depreciated in August 2008 and has now been replaced by newer equipment. The equipment is no longer supported by Cisco, but does have value in an aftermarket sale. In order to most efficiently utilize these depreciated assets, HSA is requesting to sell the portion of equipment that is no longer in use. The remaining equipment will continue to be used as part of the telecommunications system at HSA. A full listing of the assets, with notation of disposition to be sold or retained, is attached.

County Ordinance 2.24.065 allows for the sale of surplus property with a residual value greater than one thousand dollars upon approval by the Board of Supervisors.

2.24.065 Sale of personal property.

The purchasing agent is authorized to sell, trade, trade in, lease, exchange, or otherwise dispose of any personal property belonging to the county which is deemed to be surplus and not required for public use by the county and which has a value of less than one thousand dollars per individual item without prior approval by the board of supervisors. Notwithstanding any other provision of this code, such disposition of surplus property may be made without securing bids or advertising. For disposition of personal property exceeding one thousand dollars per individual item, prior approval from the board of supervisors must be obtained. All proceeds from such sales shall be paid into the county treasury for the use of the county. (Ord. CS 475 §3, 1992).

The network switching equipment, which is fully depreciated, has an estimated market value of \$1,200. The request is being made to dispose of all the items on the attached listing in one of three ways:

- Release to Auction Company
- Sale on Government Website
- County Surplus Sale

There will be no cost to the County to sell either by auctioneer or government website, the entire cost is borne by the buyer.

A County Surplus Sale would require the selling department to encounter a certain small fee such as, placing an ad in the local paper or other miscellaneous fees if necessary.

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POLICY ISSUE:

This agenda item is consistent with the Board priority of Efficient Delivery of Public Services by selling equipment no longer in use.

STAFFING IMPACT:

The salvage and sale of this equipment will be completed by current Health Services Agency and General Services Agency staff.
