

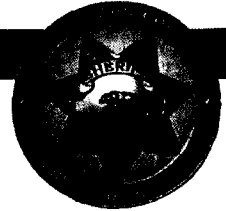
SUBJECT: ADVISORY BOARD ON SUBSTANCE ABUSE PROGRAMS
