FISCAL IMPACT: The proposed fees will enable the Department of Public Works to recover the cost of providing specific services to the general public, development community and other county departments. Based on the current year's activity, the proposed fees are anticipated to generate approximately \$7,000 in additional revenue. Actual revenues, will vary depending on the number of permit applications, plan reviews, and inspections. FISCAL IMPACT (Continued):

The proposed increase is based on an average rate of \$95 per hour for engineering services and \$90 per hour for survey services, which is the current weighted rate, with overhead, for the personnel performing these tasks. This is the final year of a 5-year plan to bring charges for engineering services in line with the actual cost of providing the service. The original plan projected that the average hourly rate in year five would be \$100, however the actual average rate is \$95, therefore the year five rate is five dollars less than originally proposed.

The increase in revenue resulting from the approval of this amendment to existing fees is expected to offset direct costs related to processing Encroachment Permits, Excavation Permits, Grading Permits, Street Improvement Permits, Construction Inspections, and services provided by the Land Survey Division. This existing fee amendment will also be used by the Planning Department to assist in processing permits associated with grading and land development/land use applications.

DISCUSSION:

The Public Works Department provides services, as required by law, to the public and the development community. Some of these services encompass construction inspection, plan review, and project review. Public Works charges fees to recoup the costs of providing these inspection and review services. Over time the cost of providing these services has increased, but the fees have not been fully recovered.

Prior to 2009, the previous fee increase was approved in 1991. Public Works realized that it would have been unreasonable to propose to increase fees in one year to cover the deficit between the fees charged and the cost of delivering the services. Therefore, Public Works proposed to increase the fees incrementally over a five-year period. In May 2009 the Board approved year one of an adjustment to the fees to recoup the cost associated with providing Engineering Services such as construction inspection, plan review and project review. Fiscal Year 2012-2013 was the fourth year of implementing the fee adjustments based on a per hour baseline rate of \$90 per hour. Staff is now recommending implementation of the fifth year base line rate of \$95 per hour.

Approval of the 2013-2014 proposed fee increases would complete the fifth year of incremental increases. The incremental adjustments covering the five-year period are shown in the following table:

Public Works proposes to use \$95 per hour as a baseline for setting fees. The proposed fees are based on the average amount of time it normally takes to perform the various inspections. Public Works is submitting for approval the Year 5 rate of \$95 shown in the above table (2013-2014) of the five-year cycle.

FEE REVIEW PROCESS

To determine the appropriateness of existing fees and identify any need for change, Public Works utilizes the following process:

- Ongoing analysis is conducted on an annual basis to determine if revenue from individual fees is sufficient to cover staff time and costs to support each function that has a fee.
- In reviewing the fee structure, Public Works identifies those fees that had not kept pace with both the amount of staff time and/or the cost of staff time to complete the task.
- Public Works' Engineering staff contacts other California counties to obtain information about the fees they charge for Plan Checks, Encroachment Permits, Excavation Permits, Street Improvement Construction Permits, Construction Inspections, and Land Survey services. For the 2013 comparison the following counties were contacted Fresno, Kern, Kings, Madera, Merced, Monterey, Sacramento, San Joaquin, Solano, Sonoma, Tulare, and Ventura.

A spreadsheet (Exhibit B) was developed listing the fees charged by those government entities along with the current Stanislaus County Public Works fees.

- The fees charged by other government entities are averaged and compared with Stanislaus County fees. In addition, the variation in methods for charging the fees is also evaluated. Variations include a flat rate, charging actual time taken to perform the services, and requiring deposits based on a percentage of the engineer's estimated cost to complete the project, and distinguishing between major and minor projects or commercial and residential projects.
- Based on the above analysis and evaluation process for 2013, Public Works has arrived at a proposed change in Construction Review and Inspection fees, Encroachment/Excavation Permit and Inspection fees, Grading Permit and Inspection fees, and Land Survey fees.

PROPOSED FEE CHANGES OF EXISTING FEES

Engineering Fees

Excavation Permit (for any excavation occurring in a County right-of-way): The basic permit fee is proposed to remain at \$20. This fee includes \$5 each for Flood Plain Administrator review and Geographic Information System (GIS) updates as related to

the improvements and \$10 for administrative fees. An additional fee for the inspection of the excavation work would change from a \$180 flat fee per 250 or 500 lineal feet of excavation of paved or unpaved area respectively to a \$190 flat fee. The fee is based on the average inspection time of two hours per project with the proposed hourly charge of \$95.

Encroachment Permit: The flat rate fee that has been charged during the last fiscal year for an encroachment permit (for construction that occurs in a County right-of-way) for driveway construction has been \$180. The proposed fee will increase this fee to \$190. Inspection for a concrete driveway takes a minimum of three inspections totaling on average two hours. With an hourly charge of \$95, two hours of inspection time equals \$190.

Construction Permits: Permits for street improvements have been charged at a flat rate fee of \$40 for the basic permit and an additional fee of \$180 per 250 lineal feet for inspection of curb and gutter work, sidewalks, and matching pavement construction, and a flat fee of \$90 for drywell inspections. Using the new baseline fee of \$95 per hour and the average inspection time for the listed services of two hours, the proposed fee is \$190 per 250 lineal feet plus base permit fee of \$40. Drywell inspections would now be \$95. The base permit fee remains unchanged and includes \$5 each for Flood Plain Administrator review and Geographic Information System (GIS) updates as related to the improvements and \$30 for administrative fees. Fees are to be paid in advance of the inspection.

Re-inspections will be increased to \$95 per hour from the current \$90 per hour. For large construction projects, a deposit of 10% of the engineer's estimate is required based on cost of the construction. Inspection time would be charged at the rate of \$95 per hour, the charge being drawn down against the deposit. At the completion of the project, the balance of the deposit would be remitted to the customer. If the deposit is not sufficient to cover all inspection charges, the customer will be billed separately for additional charges. The standard rate per hour for construction inspection is proposed at \$95 per hour.

Grading Permit: This fee is collected by the Department of Planning on Public Works' behalf for services to review and approve grading plans and provide required field inspections for projects requiring a grading permit as determined by the Department of Planning.

No change is proposed for the existing Permit application processing fee of \$30. Field inspections and plan review will be based on actual cost/minimum charge at the weighted labor rate of \$95 per hour. A deposit will be required based on the risk level as discussed above.

Land Survey Fees

Land Survey fees for Parcel Maps, Subdivision Maps, and Lot Line Adjustments will remain unchanged. Certificate of Compliance, Record of Survey, and Road Abandonment fees are proposed to increase. Certificate of Compliance fees are

proposed to increase from a straight \$695 to \$695 plus \$20 per parcel. While the existing fee is sufficient for a single parcel Certificate of Compliance, each additional parcel requires approximately 15 minutes of staff time to process. Record of Survey fees are proposed to increase from \$565 to \$700 for a map of up to four pages with the fee for each additional page being \$100. A review of previous Record of Surveys showed that most are four pages or less and take an average of 7-8 hours to review. The weighted average rate for survey staff is \$90 per hour, or approximately \$700 per Record of Survey. Additional pages require in excess of one hour to review. Road Abandonment fees are proposed to increase from \$1,110 to \$1,620. The processing of a Road Abandonment takes approximately 18 hours, for a proposed fee of \$1,620. The proposed fee increases are based on a two year review of completed like actions. The fee corresponds to the average amount of time required to process the requested action. Land Survey fees were last increased in 2004.

POLICY ISSUES:

Authority for the Department of Public Works to charge fees for use of County roads and inspection of constructions, excavations, and installations occurring in Stanislaus County streets is granted in California Street and Highways Code Chapter 5.5, Article 2, Section 1464. Authority for those fees associated with building permits is granted by California Health and Safety Code Section 17950. Authority for fees associated with Record of Surveys is granted by California Business Code Chapter 15, Article 5,

Section 8766.5. Authority for fees associated with Certificates of Compliance is granted by Government Code Title 7, Division 2, Chapter 7 Article 2, Section 66499.35. Authority for fees associated with Road Abandonment is granted by Streets and Highways Code Division 9, Part 3, Chapter 3, Section 8321.

This action is consistent with the Board's priorities of A Well-Planned Infrastructure System and the Efficient Delivery of Public Services by ensuring that inspection services can continue to be provided in a timely manner.

The proposed increases will enable Public Works staff to continue to provide services to the general public, development community and other County departments.
