## Resolution of the Stanislaus County Board of Supervisors Commemorating the 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the Stanislaus Local Agency Formation Commission (LAFCO)

- WHEREAS, after World War II, California experienced dramatic growth in population that increased demands for housing, jobs, and public services, resulting in the proliferation of cities and special districts with overlapping, inefficient service boundaries, and the premature conversion/loss of California's agriculture and open space lands;
- **WHEREAS**, in 1959, Governor Edmund G. "Pat" Brown appointed a *Commission on Metropolitan Area Problems* to study and make recommendations on the misuse of land resources, and the growing complexity of local governmental jurisdictions;
- **WHEREAS**, the Knox-Nisbet Act of 1963 was signed by Governor Brown on July 17, 1963, addressing the formation of new cities and special districts, and creating Local Agency Formation Commissions in each county in California;
- WHEREAS, the Knox-Nisbet Act, the District Reorganization Act of 1965, and the Municipal Organization Act of 1977, were successfully succeeded by the Cortese-Knox Local Government Reorganization Act of 1985; and later by the Cortese-Knox-Hertzberg Local Government Reorganization Act of 2000 (CKH Act);
- **WHEREAS**, the State Legislature has empowered LAFCOs with regulatory authority over local agency boundary changes and extension of services outside an agency's boundary;
- **WHEREAS**, State law tasks LAFCOs with encouraging orderly growth, promoting the logical formation of local agency boundaries, discouraging urban sprawl, and preserving open space and prime agricultural lands;
- WHEREAS, Stanislaus LAFCO is an independent public agency governed by a fivemember board which meets monthly in the Tenth Street Place Basement Chambers; and
- **WHEREAS**, July 17, 2013 marks the 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the establishment of LAFCOs; and Stanislaus LAFCO will commemorate its 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary at its meeting of September 25, 2013.
- **NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED**, that the Stanislaus County Board of Supervisors hereby commemorates the 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the founding of Local Agency Formation Commissions (LAFCO) and sends it heartfelt congratulations to Stanislaus LAFCO on this occasion.
