FISCAL IMPACT (Continued):

The Department anticipates the opportunity to increase revenue by attracting additional special events to be held at County parks facilities. These special event proposals, which will be brought to the Board individually for approval, could result in \$175,000 of additional revenue in the 2014-2015 Fiscal Year.

DISCUSSION:

Stanislaus County Department of Parks and Recreation (Department) operates four regional parks which charge entrance, use, and privilege/service fees: Frank Raines Off-Highway Vehicle Park, La Grange Off-Highway Vehicle Park, Modesto Reservoir, and Woodward Reservoir. The revenue collected from these fees pays for the operations and maintenance of these facilities. In addition, the Frank Raines and La Grange Off-Highway Vehicle Parks receive State grants for the operations and maintenance as well as special projects.

Annually, in preparation for the proposed budget, the Department evaluates the cost of services provided and the fees associated with these regional parks. The evaluation process includes the consideration of new or additional fees, where appropriate, as well as modifications to existing fees in order to cover the cost of operations and maintenance at these sites. The recently conducted fee survey of similar facilities in the surrounding areas found that entrance fees are comparable to other parks; therefore, the Department is not recommending increases to standard entrance fees. As the economy continues to slowly recover, the Department will continue to review proposals for small fee increases while remaining competitive and a low cost recreational alternative to our local community. At this time, the Department is looking at other ways to increase revenue by using an advertising campaign and by attracting special events to our parks.

On March 26, 2013, a comment was received during the public comment period of the Board of Supervisors meeting requesting that the Department review whether the existing Exclusive Use fee category could be used to allow mobile concessions. The Department reviewed that request and the Board approved implementing a pilot program that licensed food concessions vendors to operate at Woodward Reservoir during the 2013 park season. At this time, the Department is recommending two new fees specifically for concessions vendors, as follows:

<u>Concession Registration/Application Fee</u> – An annual fee of \$100 to cover the cost of reviewing the application(s) and working with the vendors to meet all the requirements including insurance provisions, scheduling of reserved days, and coordination between vendors and park staff to ensure regulations are met.

<u>Concession License Fee</u> - \$25 per day (scheduled in advance) for each day a vendor is scheduled to be at the park.

In 2013, the Department recommended free entrance on Veteran's Day and May 1st each year in honor of our Veterans. At the public hearing held on April 23, 2013, a request was made for the Department to consider changing the May 1st free day to the actual Memorial Day holiday.

The Department is recommending that change this year. In addition, based on comments received from the public, the Department is recommending adding a \$1 discount for Veterans, Seniors and Disabled Persons at the two Off-Highway Vehicle parks (Attachment A).

On November 25, 2013, the Department discussed the proposed fees and discounts for the Veterans with the Veterans' Advisory Commission. On January 27, 2014, the Veterans' Advisory Commission voted to support the proposed fees and the change from May 1st to the actual Memorial Day holiday (Attachment B).

In a regularly scheduled meeting on January 9, 2014, the Parks Commission discussed parks fees and placed the item on the March 13, 2014 agenda. One comment was received by email noting that as maintenance, operations, and staffing costs increase it would be wise to consider increasing fees to cover some of these costs and that while keeping fees at a minimum is a priority, the Department needs to have an efficient cost recovery process so that departmental revenue can keep pace with expenditures. In addition, it was suggested that an out-of-County fee be established for non-county residents. At this time, the Department does not have a tracking mechanism in place to determine whether a visitor comes from within or outside the County. One consideration is the large amount of traffic that can quickly back up at the entrance stations that prevent staff from spending much time on data collection and the need for a verification process which would further delay entrance to the park. The Department will continue to review processes that may allow for this suggestion in the future. The Stanislaus County Parks and Recreation Commission considered the proposed fees and supported the Department's recommendations.

On February 12, 2014, the Department held a workshop (Attachment C) to discuss the proposed fee changes with the public. One person attended the public meeting and commented that he was happy to see the per day charge lowered for concessions. No other suggestions were received regarding the proposed fees. However, the attendee had some comments regarding the Department's procedures for licensing concession vendors in 2014 which included expanding the sales to alcohol, firewood, and assorted marina-type items. Additionally he requested a review of the insurance requirements, expanded hours of vending, allowing additional advertising within the park, allowing vendors to play music, and allowing vendors to move around to different locations within the park.

The Department reviewed these requests and will include a recommendation in the Board presentation to do the following:

- Expand concessions program to include all regional park sites, allow sales of additional common marina-type items which include firewood, jet ski rentals, alcohol, etc., subject to obtaining the appropriate permits and approvals. It should be noted that when Woodward Reservoir previously had a permanent concession stand, alcohol sales were included:
- Request Risk Management and Counsel review of required insurance limits based on vendor's activity;
- Extend vending activity to 10 pm; and

 Advertising, playing music, and allowing vendors access to more than one location is subject to State regulations and park management discretion.

Information about the workshop was disseminated through the Department's normal dissemination process via e-mail to parties affected by the fees including waterfowl hunters, off-highway vehicle enthusiasts, regular users of the Exclusive Use process, the Stanislaus County Fish and Wildlife Committee, and the Stanislaus County Parks and Recreation Commission, as well as members of the public who requested to be placed on a notification list. In addition, information regarding the proposed fees is posted on the Department's Internet site.

Proposition 26

Proposition 26 was approved by California voters on the November 2010 ballot. Its passage amended sections of the California Constitution to define many fees as taxes, stipulating that they can no longer be levied or increased unless passed by not less than a two-thirds majority vote. The proposition, however, exempts specific types of fees from this requirement as follows: 1) charges imposed for entrance to or use of local government property; and 2) charges for a specific benefit, privilege, or governmental service granted directly to the payor.

County Counsel has opined that Parks and Recreation fees are exempt from Proposition 26, but did clarify that benefit, privilege, and service fees such as hunting permits and reservation fees cannot be discounted. In these fee categories, all customers must be charged equally and the amounts charged cannot exceed the reasonable cost to provide the benefit/privilege/service. The Department is not proposing to discount any benefit/privilege/service fees and the fees within these categories reflect only the cost of providing these services.

Public Hearing

Prior to levying a new fee or modifying an existing fee, the County is required by County Ordinance CS-880 (Parks and Recreation) to hold a public hearing as part of a regularly scheduled meeting of the Board of Supervisors. At that time the Board may introduce and waive the first reading of an ordinance to establish new and amend the existing fees of the Department of Parks and Recreation. If approved, these fee changes will become effective on May 8, 2014.

POLICY ISSUE:

An ordinance of the Board of Supervisors is required to establish new or amend fees for the Department of Parks and Recreation. This action is consistent with the Board's priorities of A Safe Community, A Healthy Community, A Well Planned Infrastructure System, and the Efficient Delivery of Public Services by making funds available to the Department of Parks and Recreation to continue to operate efficiently and effectively, and to assist in promoting a safe and healthy environment and improving the quality of life in Stanislaus County.

This ordinance shall take effect May 8, 2014 and before the expiration of fifteen (15) days after its passage it shall be published once, with the names of the members voting for and against the same, in the Modesto Bee, a newspaper published in the County of Stanislaus, State of California.

- Extending hours of vending operation, additional advertising, playing music, and allowing access to more than one location is subject to State regulations and park management discretion

Modified Recommendations:

- Alcohol sales end at 9pm
- No glass containers
- While permanent concession stand previously sold alcohol, if problems result staff may need to revisit this

- Stanislaus County Park Commission moved to support the proposed fees at their meeting on March 13, 2014
- Public notices were printed in the Modesto Bee on March 14, 2014, and March 20, 2014
- Proposed fees were also posted on the Department's website
