Approval of the Final Completion and Acceptance of the Construction of the AB 900 Phase II Public Safety Center Project One (Maximum Security Housing, and Medical/Mental Health Housing) and Project Three (Intake, Release and Transportation) with Hensel Phelps Construction Company of San Jose, California; and Related Actions

DISCUSSION:

The Public Safety Center Expansion Projects are comprised of the following four elements:

Project One (Maximum Security Housing, Medical/Mental Health Housing) – Includes two maximum-security housing units (240 beds each), a special needs housing unit, a medical and mental health housing unit (72 beds), health services facility and security administration, funded 90% by Assembly Bill/AB 900 Phase II funding and 10% by County matching funds.

Project Two (Day Reporting Center) – Includes the Programs / Day Reporting Center, funded 90% by Assembly Bill/AB 900 Phase II funding and 10% by County matching funds. The Board of Supervisors approved and accepted final completion of this Project on August 11, 2015. Projects One and Two together comprise the Assembly Bill 900 Phase II Project between the County and the State of California.

Project Three (Intake, Release, and Transportation) – Includes various support facilities funded entirely by County funds through money set aside from Public Facility Fees.

Project Four (Re-Entry and Alternatives to Custody Training (REACT) Center – Includes 288 additional beds and much needed program space that will focus on a continuum of care to break the cycle of recidivism, funded 90% by Senate Bill 1022 funding and 10% by County matching funds. The Board of Supervisors awarded a design-build construction contract to Roebellen Contracting Incorporated on April 19, 2016 and the project is currently under construction.

Construction Completion and Closeout of AB 900 Phase II Project One (Maximum Security Housing, Medical / Mental Health Housing) and Project Three (Intake, Release and Transportation)

The Stanislaus County Public Safety Center Expansion Projects One and Three will provide much needed expansion of the Stanislaus County Public Safety Center facilities. These new facilities will provide for safe, modern and appropriate detention facilities including adequate inmate medical care and maximum security housing options that were not available before. These facilities will serve multiple functions within the Stanislaus County public safety mission, including an upgrade to the county's ability to provide inmate programming to maximum security and mental health inmates. This operational approach includes seventy-two Medical/Mental Health and special needs beds (57-bed medical/mental health beds and 15 sheltered hospital beds) and two 240-bed Maximum Security Housing Units for a total of 552 additional beds.

The Contracts for AB 900 Phase II Project One (Maximum Security Housing, Medical / Mental Health Housing) and Project Three (Intake, Release and Transportation) were awarded to Hensel Phelps Construction Company by the Board of Supervisors on June 17, 2014.

The Board of Supervisors authorized a limited time extension to the Contractor on November 8, 2016 for exterior landscape improvements. These improvements are now

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complete. The Project Manager accepted Final Completion of Project Three from Hensel Phelps on November 21, 2016 and Final Completion of Project One on December 5, 2016. Although both of these completion dates were slightly beyond the initially projected global completion date of November 15, 2016 for both Projects, the Project team collaborated on various solutions that provided important extra value to the County. These added benefits to the County include additional one-on-one training to the Sheriff's team for the new facilities and its security electronic systems; additional programming adjustments to the security electronics system with oversight from the Hensel Phelps staff; support for the Sheriff's Transition Team for facility opening; additional on-site technical support team during the mid-March 2017 facility opening including the 8-day training planned; on-site technical support from March 28 to April 4, 2017; and finally, an additional 12 months of warranty coverage for the Security Electronics System, which is a highly technical critical component for the operation of the new facilities.

Next Steps for Project One and Project Three

While construction of the facilities is now complete, much work continues to prepare the facilities for opening and commencement of operations in the Spring of 2017. Funds available in the Project Three budget will provide for the completion of landscaping and site work. Design is underway for these improvements. Also, the State of California approved a contract with Global Tel*Link to install a video visitation system in both Project One and Project Three on December 7, 2016. Video Visitation is a key component of both projects and will be completed prior to the opening of Project One and Project Three on March 18, 2017.

The completion of these projects, the largest Capital Projects undertaken by the County, is a significant accomplishment for the community. It is recommended that the Project Manager plan an appropriate public dedication ceremony prior to the phased opening in the early spring of 2017 to recognize this accomplishment. These two new facilities are key components in the County's justice system focus on improved public safety.

POLICY ISSUE:

The Board of Supervisors has the responsibility for final acceptance of capital improvement projects.

FISCAL IMPACT:

The total project budget for the AB 900 Phase II Public Safety Center Expansion Projects remains unchanged at \$89.5 million to fund Project One (Maximum Security Housing, Medical/Mental Health Housing) and Project Two (Day Reporting Center). The funding sources remain unchanged with State funding of \$80 million (90%), and a County cash match contribution totaling \$9.5 million (10%) comprised of 2006 Tobacco Endowment Fund Borrowing (\$7 million), Public Facility Fees Cash (\$1.5 million) and Criminal Justice Facility Fund Cash (\$1 million). The companion Project Three (Intake, Release and Transportation) is

funded 100% by Public Facility Fees Cash. All three Projects have been completed on schedule and under budget.

The final construction contract with Hensel Phelps Construction Company for Project One is \$68,729,917, which includes the original contract amount of \$64,943,000 and \$3,786,917 in approved Change Orders. The final construction contract for Project Three is \$18,553,173, which included the original contract amount of \$17,749,000 and \$804,173 in approved Change Orders. Both projects will definitely complete well under budget, which will represent savings for both the County and the State of California.

BOARD OF SUPERVISORS' PRIORITY:

These actions will advance the Board of Supervisors' priority to strive for A Safe Community by increasing detention capacity to meet projected needs and the use of alternatives to incarceration, and program opportunity consistent with the Public Safety Realignment.

These actions also support the Board's priority to provide Efficient Delivery of Public Services in pursuing State funds by leveraging limited County resources effectively.

STAFFING IMPACT:

The existing Capital Projects Team and the Sheriff's Transition Team will continue to collaborate as they focus on the successful completion of this major Public Safety Center expansion effort and prepare to commence operations at Projects One and Three.

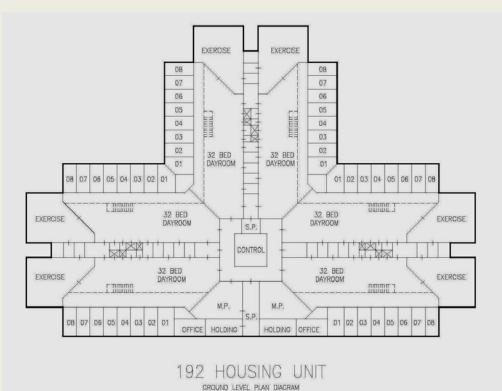
Initial Housing Concept and Redesign
