Ex-Officio Members (inactive, honorary membership):
any of Stanislaus County's State & Federal elected representatives
Children's Council Executive Director (no voting privileges)

DUTIES: Shall include, but not be limited to: Promote public & private collaboration for the provision of children's services. Encourage the integration for countywide interagency case management to provide optimum service delivery for children and their families. Facilitate the development of policies and priorities to ensure service effectiveness to children and families in Stanislaus County. Develop goals, objectives and outcome measures to provide accountability & to evaluate the degree of quali- & quantitative success of the Council & its projects. Establish policy & procedures for conducting the Council's business. Identify gaps in services to specific populations.
