The CEO announced that SB 375, Library tax relief bill, was vetoed by the Governor and the County will pursue the reduction of the administrative cost with the Board of Equalization. Assemblymember House has said he will bring back the bill next legislative year if the County is unsuccessful at the Board of Equalization. The CEO noted that the Governor signed the Welfare Reform Bill. He also thanked the City of Modesto for their assistance with the relocation of Welfare recipients with City Community and Development Grant Funds. The County's COP reserve funds, about \$7.3 million, were bid out for reinvestment so that the County will receive \$1.4 million more over the next eighteen years. The CEO noted that the electronic monitoring program for the Juvenile Justice Program was started last Friday with four kids.
