Chairman Grover presented a resolution proclaiming the week of 1/9/05 as Family Services Specialist Recognition Week.

Sheriff Weidman responded to a citizen complaint voiced at the 1/4/05 Board meeting regarding cars parking on the new sidewalks in the Shackelford neighborhood. He showed photographs of the sidewalks in the neighborhood, and noted that no cars were parked on the sidewalks. He also noted that the Sheriff's department would continue to address public safety issues in this neighborhood.

Mayfield/O'Brien (4-0)(Simon absent) **9:25am** The Board received written requests to remand Use Permit Application #2004-13, McHenry Golf Center, back to the Planning Commission from both the Applicant and Appellant regarding the appeal of Planning Commission decision for Use Permit Application #2004-13, McHenry Golf Center, a request to establish a golf driving range on an 18+ acre parcel in the A-2-40 (General Agriculture) zoning district on McHenry Ave., north of Kiernan Ave./Claribel Rd., in the north Modesto area; and, the Board approved the requests and remanded the Application back to the Planning Commission with direction to reconsider a revised project at a new location as set forth in the letters from the Appellant and Applicant 2005-48

O'Brien/Mayfield (4-0)(Simon absent) 9:30am Finds Rezone Application #2004-05 and Parcel Map Application #2004-14, Kelly Business Park, a request to rezone 4.35 acres from A-2-40 (General Agriculture) to PD (Planned Development) and to create two parcels to allow the development with Commercial/Industrial uses consistent with others in the surrounding vicinity and to allow a new gymnasium to be constructed adjacent to an existing church within the proposed PD, to be De Minimis for the purposes of collection of Fish and Game Fees pursuant to California Code of Regulations §753.5, by adopting the findings of fact contained in the attached Certificate of Fee Exemption, those findings being based on the analyses presented in the Initial Study, and ordered the filing of the Certificate of Fee Exemption with the Stanislaus County Clerk-Recorder's Office; adopted the Mitigated Negative Declaration pursuant to CEQA Guidelines §15074(b), by finding that on the basis of the whole record, including the Initial Study and any comments received, that there is no substantial evidence the project will have a significant effect on the environment and that the Mitigated Negative Declaration reflects Stanislaus County's independent judgment and analysis; adopted the Mitigation Monitoring Plan pursuant to CEQA Guidelines §15074(d); ordered the filing of a Notice of Determination with the Stanislaus County Clerk-Recorder's Office pursuant to Public Resources Code §21152 and CEQA Guidelines §15075; finds that the project is consistent with the overall goals and policies of the County General Plan; finds that the proposed PD zoning is consistent with the Planned Development General Plan description; determined that none of the findings precluding parcel map approval can be made; finds that the project

will increase activity in and around the project area, and increase demands for roads and services, thereby requiring dedications and improvements; approved Rezone Application #2004-05, subject to the Development Standards; approved Parcel Map Application #2004-14, subject to the Development Standards; and, introduced, waived the reading and adopted Ordinance C.S. 912 for the approved Rezone Application #2004-05 - Planning ORD-54-V-1; 2005-49 & 2005-50

Corr 1 Referred to the Stanislaus County Redevelopment Agency, a letter from the California Housing Finance Agency regarding the approval of round one of FY 2004/05 HELP Program funding for Stanislaus County in the amount of \$562,500.

Supervisor DeMartini noted that he, the Deputy Director of Planning, County Counsel, and the Agricultural Commissioner attended a recent Patterson School Board meeting where the school board approved purchasing land outside the Patterson sphere of influence to build a school. He stated that the County gave a presentation based on facts opposing this project, as not being consistent with the agricultural zone, and raising traffic issues. In addition, a letter from the Farm Bureau opposing the purchase was presented.

Supervisor Mayfield spoke regarding an upcoming Air Pollution Control District meeting. He noted that the Air District has a new rule planned for every month of this year, including rules regarding wine fermentation tanks and dust which will affect the way we do business in the valley.

DeMartini/Mayfield (4-0)(Simon absent) *Legislative A. Authorized the Chairman of the Board of Supervisors to send a letter to the Governor requesting that Proposition 42 transportation funds not be diverted to the State's General Fund 2005-51

The CEO gave a brief update regarding the Governor's January budget proposal. He stated that on 1/25/04 a more complete report would be presented to the Board, as well as the 2005 Legislative Platform. The Governor's proposed budget identifies a \$9.1 billion difference between revenues and expenditures for the two-year period ending June 2006. The Governor plans to utilize half of the remaining economic recovery bond, suspend Prop 42, and reduce funding for Prop 98, schools, education, health and human services, general government, resources, and youth/adult corrections. The proposal will have a significant impact on Stanislaus County, and the CEO will be distributing a more complete analysis in the days ahead.
