Chairwoman Olsen announced that this meeting will be held in accordance with the Governor's Stay at Home Executive Order N-33-20 and will not include in person public attendance. She reviewed the options for the members of the public to observe the meeting and provide comments to the Board via email or telephone as listed on the first page of the agenda.

Invocation was given by the Cindy Marks with Pray Modesto.

CEO Hayes provided an update on the 2019 Novel Coronavirus (COVID-19) Emergency and explained the effort this week will focus specifically on the Turlock Nursing and Rehabilitation Center. The CEO shared updates to the <u>www.stanemergency.com</u> website explaining it now shows live, up-to-date information.

Rick Santos, StanCERA Executive Director, gave a presentation to the Board regarding the Stanislaus County Employees' Retirement Association (StanCERA).

Kathaleen Bach spoke in support of the reservoirs reopening.

David Bach voiced concerns regarding the reservoirs being closed.

Miguel Donoso voiced concerns about the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act money being spent correctly.

Margaret McKain inquired via email what the process is for COVID-19 testing.

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Amendments are consistent with the overall goals and policies of the County General Plan and Salida Community Plan; (c) the County and other affected governmental agencies will be able to maintain levels of service consistent with the ability of the governmental agencies to provide a reasonable level of service; (d) the Agricultural Land Conversion Findings can be made, as outlined in Policy 2.7 of the General Plan's Agricultural Element; (e) the proposed Planned Development (P-D) zoning is consistent with approval of the General Plan Amendment; (f) the project will increase activities in and around the project area, and increase demands for roads and services, thereby requiring improvements; approved General Plan Amendment and Rezone Application No. PLN2019-0045, Beeler Development, subject to the Development Standards attached to the April 16, 2020 Planning Commission Staff Report attached to the agenda item; and, introduced, waived the reading, and adopted ordinance C.S. 1271 – Planning ORD-56-U-2 2020-0186

Chiesa/Berryhill unan. 7.2 Conducted a public hearing to consider the Planning Commission's recommendation of approval for General Plan Amendment and Rezone Application No. PLN2019-0077, Derrel's Mini Storage, a request to amend the General Plan and zoning designation of a 9.77 acre parcel from Agriculture and A-2-40 to Planned Development (P-D) and amend the Zoning designation of three parcels totaling three acres from expired P-D (202) to a new P-D to allow expansion of an existing mini storage and RV storage business in phases, located at 5024, 5038, and 5118 Tunson Road, and 907 Kiernan Avenue, on the north side of Kiernan Avenue, in the Modesto area; adopted the Negative Declaration pursuant to CEQA Guidelines Section 15074(b), by finding that, on the basis of the whole record, including the Initial Study and any comments received, that there is no substantial evidence the project will have a significant effect on the environment and that the Negative Declaration reflects Stanislaus County's independent judgment and analysis; ordered the filing of a Notice of Determination with the Stanislaus County Clerk Recorder's Office pursuant to Public Resources Code Section 21152 and CEOA Guidelines Section 15075; finds, based on the discussion in the report, and the whole of the record that: (a) the General Plan Amendment will maintain a logical land use pattern without detriment to existing and planned land uses; (b) the County and other affected governmental agencies will be able to maintain levels of service consistent with the ability of the governmental agencies to provide a reasonable level of service; (c) the amendment is consistent with the General Plan goals and policies; (d) the Agricultural Land Conversion Findings can be made, as outlined in Policy 2.7 of the General Plan's Agricultural Element; (e) the alternative to the Agricultural Buffer Standards applied to this project provides equal or greater protection than the existing buffer standards; (f) the project will increase activities in and around the project area, and increase demands for roads and services, thereby requiring improvements; finds that the proposed Planned Development zoning is consistent with the Planned Development General Plan designation; approved General Plan Amendment and Rezone Application No. PLN2019-0077–Derrel's Mini Storage, subject to the Development Standards attached to the 03/19/2020 Planning Commission Staff Report, including an amendment to proposed Development Standard No. 32, attached to the agenda item; and, introduced, waived the reading, and adopted ordinance C.S. 1270 – Planning ORD-56-U-1 2020-0187

Berryhill/Withrow unan. **8.1** Authorized the use of up to \$3,000,000 from the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act to fund all 334 qualified Small Business Relief Program applicants; directed the Auditor-Controller to make the budget adjustments as reflected in the budget journal attached to the agenda item; and, authorized the transfer of up to \$2,000,000 to the Small Business Relief Program from the Community Development Fund – CEO 2020-0188
