*Excludes clean, dry, uncontaminated, and recyclable (not excessively damaged) mattresses and box springs, which may be disposed of at no cost for residents, once and for so long as the County has entered into contract with the Mattress Recycling Council for handling of these materials. Mattresses are defined as "a resilient material or combination of materials that is enclosed by a ticking (the outermost layer of fabric or related material of a mattress) and is intended or promoted for sleeping upon." Box springs are defined as that "which is used to support a mattress and may include constructed wood or other frames, steel springs, or other materials used alone or in combination." Specifically excluded from this definition are: waterbed mattresses, futon pads, mattress toppers or pads, juvenile and crib mattresses, and air mattresses.
