TO THE LEFT OF THE 4-WAY STOP

Egret Cove (Day Use): The first parking area on the right

Fischer Point (Camping): At the 1st dirt road, turn right (Sites 1-30)

Charlie's Point (Camping): At the1st dirt road, turn right, and take another right (Sites31-46)

Office Point (Day Use): At the 1st paved road, turn right and drive to the parking lot. Restrooms and Life Jack

Main Lawn/Horse Shoe Pits (Day Use): Between the 1st and 2nd paved roads.

Picnic Shelter: At the 2nd paved road, turn right. It's at the rear of the parking lot. Reservations can be made at www.stancountyparks.com.

Main Boat Ramp (No overnight parking): At the 3rd paved road, turn right.

Picnic Cove (Day Use): The 1st area at the end of the road. Picnic Point (Day Use): The 2nd area at the end of the road. (1.4 mi from entrance station.)

STRAIGHT ACROSS FROM THE 4-WAY STOP

Hackberry Flat (Reservation Camping w/Hook-ups, Sites 47-86)

- .5 mi from entrance station. Showers and Restrooms available.

T- Island (Reservation Camping w/Hook-ups, Sites 87-127): Go through Hackberry Flat and cross the causeway.

-.8mi from entrance station. Restrooms are available. Showers available at Hackberry Flat.

TO THE RIGHT OF THE 4-WAY STOP

Muniz Point (Day Use): All the shoreline from the 4-way stop to the Maintenance Yard.

Dump Station: Turn right at the 4-way stop. Watch for it on the right just past the Maintenance Yard. Heron Point/Boat Ramp (Day Use): Just around the bend from the dump station.



The fees set forth in this Fees Schedule (above) shall be paid by all persons using a recreation area except as may be otherwise provided by the following regulations or by the Stanislaus County Code. If the entrance station is unattended, fees MUST be paid at the self-registration post (iron ranger) prior to entering the park. You must retain the receipt from the envelope as proof of payment of fees. Receipts must be shown upon exiting the park.

Persons using the facilities "without "paying will be subject to citation. All fees listed are per day/per night/per vehicle/per vessel. (SCC, 18.08.050)

- 1. <u>DAY-USE</u> areas are closed from 10 p.m. to 6 a.m. every day. All vehicles in the park between 10 p.m. and 6 a.m. are subject to camping fees. Day use receipts and decals do not apply during that time period. Vehicles entering the park prior to 6 a.m. are subject to camping fees. Day use is prohibited in campsites unless visiting paid campsite.
- 2ND VEHICLE AT HOOK-UP SITE: to qualify for the reduced fee, all occupants of the vehicle must join a party already camping in the park, must not establish a separate camp unit as determined by Park Staff. This reduced fee shall applyto one vehicle only.
- 3. HOLIDAY WEEKEND FEE: A holiday weekend fee will be assessed for 3 weekend nights in addition to regular camping fees as follows: If a holiday falls on a Friday, the "3 DAY HOLIDAY" camping fees will be collected from all visitors entering the park to camp Thursday, Friday, and Saturday nights. If a holiday falls on a Monday, the "3 DAY HOLIDAY" camping fees will be collected from all visitors entering the park to camp on Friday, Saturday, and Sunday nights..
- 4. HOLIDAY DAY USE FEE: A holiday day use fee will be assessed in addition to each vehicle day use fee paid on Memorial Day, Independence Day, and Labor Day
- 5. ANNUAL PASSES: Annual passes are per calendar year and valid for day use only. To receive a replacement for annual passes, proof of annual pass purchase is required by original receipt holder.
- SPECIAL FEES & DISCOUNTS: Only one discount is allowed per qualified individual.
 - a. FIREWORKS SHOW: The fireworks show fee will be assessed to all vehicles on the day/night of the show.
 - b. **DISABLED DISCOUNT:** To qualify for the disabled discount, the individual must be able to provide verification that they are disabled.
 - c. **SENIOR DISCOUNT:** To qualify for the senior discount, the individual must be age 62 or older.
 - d. VETERAN DISCOUNT: Veteran must be present and proof of veteran's status must be presented with a valid gov't issued photo ID, if the proof itself has no photo. Accepted forms of proof are: CA Distinguished Veteran Pass, DD-214 Cert, valid Military ID, Dept. of Veterans Affairs ID, and other IDs approved by Dept.
 - Veterans may receive a one-vehicle discount of \$5 per night from November 1st through November 14th.
 - ii. Veterans will be waived the day-use and/or camping fee on Veteran's Day and Memorial Day (this include applicable vessels attached to the Veteran vehicle.)
- 7. PICNIC SHELTER RESERVATIONS may be reserved on line at www.stancountyparks.com/reserve
- 8. **RESERVATION FEE**: Use of picnic shelter will be subject to a reservation fee of \$10.00 per day. Exclusive use event reservations are also subject to a per-day reservation fee
- LATE EXIT FEE: A late exit fee will be assessed to any day use vehicle exiting after 10:00 p.m.
- 10. The EXCLUSIVE USE of an identified park area requires advance approval by the Director per event. Liability insurance is required for most exclusive events. (SCC, 18.06.010)

CONTINUED FEESCHEDULE RULES AND REGULATIONS...

- 11. <u>REFUNDS</u>: Parks staff are not authorized to give refunds. To be eligible for a full refund on Exclusive and Special Events, requests must be made 7 days prior to the reserved date. Fees will apply to any cancellations and/or changes, 24 hours for online reservations. Cancellation charge/ fee may apply. Refunds shall be made by application to the director.
- 12. <u>Authorized Field Training Dog Permits</u>: Shall be subject to the following regulations: (a) A permit holder may only use the area designated by a Park Staff;(b) Issuance of the permit shall not constitute an assurance that dog training activities will be authorized on any particular day or for any number of days, it being understood that dog training activities shall not interfere with other established uses of the recreation area; (c) The permittee shall sign a hold harmless agreement in the form prescribed by the Director; and, (d) A permit shall be valid for the calendar year, and the fee shall not be prorated.

PARK RULES AND REGULATIONS

FOR YOUR SAFETY AND ENJOYMENT, PLEASE OBSERVE THE FOLLOWING:

It is unlawful and constitutes an infraction/misdemeanor for any person to violate or fail to comply with any of the following provisions in any recreation area. (Stanislaus County Code, Title 18, Parks and Recreation)

A. PROHIBITED AT THE FACILITY

- 1. Firearms, fireworks, slingshots, BB guns, bows and arrows, Missile-launching devices, paint ball weapons, bounce houses, waterslides, trampolines, refuse collecting, and collecting cans and bottles for recycling.
- Golfing or putting of golf balls
- 3. Attaching, removing, injuring or causing damage to any plants, trees, shrubs, lawn, flowers, or rocks (no tree swings)
- 4. Defacing, removal, sitting on, mooring from, covering, or obstructing of Department signs, structures, posts, barriers, or buoys
- 5. Obstruction of vehicular or pedestrian traffic
- 6. Nudity—appearing in public view without sufficient clothing to cover private areas of the body.
- 7. Engagement in physical violence or any unlawful actions which violates County, State, or Federal laws.
- . NO swimming off-boat ramp areas and beyond 200 feet from the shoreline or outside the 5 M.P.H. zones.
- Unreasonable use of audio equipment or loud music causing disturbances to other park patrons (PC 415e). No amplified music is allowed without a special
 event permit.

B. PARK PATRONS MUST (SCC, 18.20.030)

- Comply with all signs posted by the Department.
- 2. Comply with lawful instructions of a Park staff/officer.

C. MOTOR VEHICLES IN THE PARK

- 1. All sections of California Vehicle Code will be enforced. (SCC, 18.20.010)
- All vehicles must stay on designated roads and parking areas.
- 3. Major vehicle repairs are prohibited in the park.

D. CAMPING (SCC, 18.08.040)

- Reservations are required to occupy campsites at Hackberry Flat, Muir Point & T-Island.
- Any first come, first served campsites not visibly identifiable as occupied or established will be subjected to removal and issued a notice to contact staff with verifiable paid status within 24 hours. The definition of an occupied/established campsite, shall have a vehicle with a visible paid receipt in the windshield, or all of the following equipment—travel trailer/RV, tent and a reasonable amount of camping equipment.
- 3 Overnight campers under 18 years of age must be accompanied by a responsible adult.
- 4 Campers may only occupy and place equipment on their selected campsite.
- Campers must keep a clean campsite at all times and upon leaving.
- Non reserved campers must vacate campsites no later than 5:00 P.M. on the last camping day as stated on their receipt.
- 7 **Reserved** campsite must be vacated by 2:00 P.M on the last day of reservation.
- 8 No person may hold, occupy, or reserve another campsite for someone else.
- There is a maximum of 2 vehicles allowed per campsite maximum 8 people per campsite.
- 10 All paid campsites must be able to show receipts within a 24 hour period. Any campsite that cannot have payment verified within 24 hours are subject to
 - a forfeiture of campsite and personal items left in the campsite.
- 1 Tents or other camping equipment left unattended for more than 24 hours shall be deemed to be abandoned, and shall be subject to removal by Park Staff/Officer. (SCC, 18.08.060)
- 12 No person shall camp for more than a total of 15 nights at any one recreation facility or during any 30-day period.
- 13 Campfires CANNOT be left unattended and must be extinguished upon leaving the campsite area.
- 14 Campfires MUST be contained or in the fire rings provided.
- 15 Keep all flammable materials away from the fire area to prevent spread.
- 16 Gather FIREWOODS only in designated areas. Woodcutting is prohibited.

E. WATERCRAFTS

- 1. BOATERS MUST OPERATE AT A SPEED AS NOT TO ENDANGER THEMSELVES OR PASSENGERS AND TO AVOID BOAT DAMAGE.
- A QUAGGA/ZEBRAMUSSEL SELF-CERTIFICATION IS REQUIRED ON ALL WATERCRAFTS
- All vessels must meet U.S. Coast Guard equipment requirements and state noise level requirements.
- 4. All vessels must comply with the provisions of the Harbors and Navigation Code, the regulations of the California Department of Boating and Waterways, and any other regulations enacted by these laws. (SCC, 18.20.020)
- . No vessel may be occupied by a number of persons greater than the vessel's designed weight and/or passenger capacity.
- 6. No maintenance or rigging of any boat while on the boat ramps.
- Boat trailers must be parked in the spaces provided and may not be left parked in the waters of the lake. (SCC, 18.20.030)
- B. Right of Ways: Sailboats have the right-of-way. Skiers on the water have the right-of-way over all.
- Travel pattern for all boats shall be counter-clockwise.
- 10. No moving, sitting on, mooring from, covering, obstructing or defacing buoys.
- 11. NO PADDLEBOATS/AIR FLOATING DEVICES beyond the 5 M.P.H. zones or 200 feet beyond the shorelines.
- 12. Boaters must not use a speed in excess of 5 M.P.H. when within 100 feet of any persons in the water and within 200 feet of any person-occupied beach, dock, or mooring buoy.

F. PETS/HORSES (SCC, 18.08.070)

- 1. Pets must be kept under control and on a leash at all times while in the park (6 feet if walking, 10 feet if staked). Owner must possess proof of current rabies
- 2. All owners or handlers shall be responsible to retrieve and properly dispose of fecal material in a sanitary manner.
- 3. Horses are permitted in area A through FF and Cocklebur Beach day use area. Restrictions to these areas may apply at Stanislaus County discretion..
