E. AGENDA ITEMS 7 AND 8

ACTIONS & REPORTER

The Grayson Community Center/Park Programs and Activities, and the Audubon Society line items on the agenda were tabled. Both organizations were not present.

I. STAFF REPORTS

ACTIONS & REPORTER

 Staff are in the process of applying weed abatement throughout all parks and facilities. Applicable irrigations systems are also inspected for repairs during this time of year. Parks Staff

- 2. The owl boxes were installed at Fairview Park for rodent control. Smoke bombs were also used to control ground squirrels.
- 3. Woodward Reservoir is in the process of revamping the dry storage area. Staff are also preparing for the upcoming firework show at the reservoir. The Department is in the process of obtaining quotes from the two firework providers available. This year's firework show will be on Saturday, July 6, 2013.
- 4. The waterfowl season is coming to an end on the 20th of February. Hunters are given until March 10th to remove their blinds.
- 5. Both reservoirs receive annual fish plants from the State at various times from October through March. About 2,050 pounds of fish were planted in last year. The Department just received an award from the Stanislaus Fish and Wildlife Committee for additional plants that will include the specie largemouth bass, blue gills, crappie, and channel fish.
- 6. The Polar Bear Day event had thirty participants.
- The cattle guard at Turlock Fishing Access was recently repaired from being too
 high for vehicles to cross over. Staff also picked up about twenty pounds of loose
 scattered nails in the dirt roadway.
- 8. The equipment grant from the Cordless Zero Emissions Lawn and Garden Equipment Demonstration Program is still in progress with one mower currently received. Other equipment are still on order for test trials. The mower received was broken down once with parts on order for the repair. All equipment are battery operated.
- 9. The Department's seasonal staffing recruitment for the year is in progress. The number of workers to be hired will vary throughout the summer season based on need and budget.
- 10. Frank Raines OHV Park has a couple off-road events scheduled. The Sacramento PITS will be holding two motorcycle trials—one in February and another in April. La Grange OHV Park had a 4x4 truck event with many OHV enthusiasts in the park on January 12th.
- 11. Following up from the previous meeting, the question regarding whether the County logo was embedded into the new Laird Park sign was asked; the logo will be embedded. The concern was in regards to vandalism. The sign is to be placed in the park in March.
- 12. At Bonita Ranch Park, a lighting project is in progress to add lighting to the park. A small section between the PAL building and residential area will be a small lawn and play area. Bonita pool is still at the concept stage. The Department will look at the Bonita pool project once the lighting project is complete.

- 1. A final draft of the mural policy was reviewed. The second page now includes verbiage that will include a routing slip as a part of the application process. The routing process will route in the following order: Parks and Recreation Department, Planning Department, Parks and Recreation Department, and Park Commission. The Commission's role will be to evaluate the proposal based on the policy, and advise the applicant of an approval or rejection status.
- 2. Consulting with the Planning Department in regards to notifying neighboring properties, the County does not have a standard in this type of notification except only when it involves CEQA regulations. A suggestion was made, as an option if any, for notifications to be sent to the surrounding property owners or within a quarter-mile vicinity. The Commission was in consensus with contacting adjacent property owners, subject to case by case review. The applicant is to provide a description of their proposal with a letter/flyer to the adjacent property owners and/or other affected parties, and submit a copy of the notice to the Parks and Recreation Department. Mailing addresses or contact information of property owners should be included in the proposal packet to the Department. A copy of the property owner notification will be included in the monthly Park Commission meeting notices, which will also be sent to the provided list of contacts. Staff may also review the list of contacts for appropriate contacts. This item was approved upon motion and second with the changes mentioned.

J. COMMISSION COMMENTS
