1.	The water level for Woodward Reservoir will remain up at recreational levels indefinitely until further notices are given by the Irrigation Districts. Both Modesto and Woodward Reservoirs will remain open past the previously given date of July.	Merry Mayhew
2.	Relating to park vandalisms, the Commission considered including in their letter to the community also information to encourage neighborhood watch or community involvement. The Hatch Park and Bonita Ranch Park MAC communities are active and involved in the two parks' security watch. The surrounding neighbors are making efforts to contact Sheriff as needed on park vandalism and suspicious activities.	
3.	A new technology of self-sufficient underground irrigation was suggested to be considered in any future and new irrigation plans. This layering technology allows watering from underneath the grounds where no sprinkler heads are needed.

COMMUNITY PARKS/COUNTY CENTERS by Amanda Fife:

1. <u>Fairview Park</u>: All of the tables and grills have been placed at the park. (Photos attached.) This completes this phase of the project for the funding that was available. We were contacted by a member of the citizens group, expressing an interest in repairing the chain link fencing on either side of the backstop. Volunteer forms were emailed and attempts to call were made. No response has been received from them yet.



COMMUNITY PARKS/COUNTY CENTERS by Amanda Fife (CONTINUED):

- 2. The family style BBQ that was placed at the picnic shelter was slightly damaged the first night it was in place. Damage was to the access door where the ash is emptied. Staff was able to repair it. The last owl box that was installed was vandalized and completely destroyed the same night. There were no signs that owls had ever inhibited the boxes and they will most likely not be replaced.
- 3. <u>Bonita Ranch Park</u>: Vandalism to the irrigation system continues to be a problem however it has not been on a daily basis as it was last month. Staff has been finding one or two damaged sprinklers each week but on occasion they discovered five in one day.
- 4. <u>Frank Raines OHV:</u> The OHV Park was closed for fire season on 6/20/2014. The campground and Rec. Hall remain open.
- 5. <u>Parklawn:</u> The poured in place playground surface was damaged in two spots. It appears that someone dug out large portions of the material. Repair kits can be purchased and we will be looking into the cost of getting it fixed. It does not pose a safety issue at this time. This is the first vandalism incident to the surfacing material since it was installed in 2008.

MODESTO RESERVOIR by Tom Dias:

- 1. On 6/22/14, forty-nine vessels were inspected for Quagga Mussels by Debbie DeShaun and her trained dog. None were detected.
- 2. Park staff sold 34 bags of ice and 19 bundles of firewood last week.
- 3. The contractor has started installing the new vaulted toilets.
- 4. The water level is now around 21 feet.

LaGrange:
