	 Nutria project is underway in which all bodies of water north of Visalia are being checked for nutria. The purpose of this project is to eradicate the invasive species, which is destructive to wetlands, levy systems and also carry a disease that can be transmitted through water. The current concern is that nutria are moving north towards the Delta. When found they are being trapped. Currently there is a total of 52 live traps. 	Philip McKay

	 Early reports of the salmon out migration season indicate good numbers of fish moving out from both the Tuolumne and Stanislaus rivers. There is good flow conditions resulting from the recent rain fall. Don Pedro has experienced turbidity issues due to the sediment moving in from the rim fire, however, high turbidity makes for good water conditions for salmon. 	Jason Guignard
Η.	WILDLIFE ENFORCEMENT REPORT	REPORTER
	 Ryan provided the CDFW 2017 overview for Stanislaus County. Due to an increase of staff wildlife officers made just under 6,000 contacts, which is a 50% increase over the 2016 number. As a direct result of the contacts, there were a total of 254 violations. Out of those violations 236 citations were issued, which is a 34% increase from the previous year. The 1st quarter of 2018 is experiencing the same rate of increase. 	Ryan Detrick

	 Bob placed several wood duck boxes out on his property. The Committee is willing to approve fund requests for supplies and materials to build new wood duck boxes. River Partners put up 10 boxes, however, they are unable to monitor them due to staffing levels. 	Bob Bashaw
J.	OLD BUSINESS AND COMMITTEE COMMENTS	ACTIONS & REPORTER
	 Reservoir Biologist, Joe Millosovich, presented information on the process of building a sustainable fish habitat at Woodward and Modesto Reservoir. Initial step would be to conduct a fish survey for the purpose of identifying the type of fishery that needs improving. The survey would provide the percentage of catch, condition of species, relative abundance and proportional stock density. Secondly, a site assessment to determine the type and quality of preexisting habitat would be performed. The survey data is analyzed to determine which locations of the reservoir would be most beneficial to place new habitat. A Notice of Exemption would be needed due to the potential of the new habitat materials affecting other preexisting species in the reservoir i.e. threat and endangered species. The best habitat is created out of natural material. 	Joe Millosovich
	 Committee members will be conducting a survey of the Del Puerto Canyon guzzlers in May in preparation of a possible upcoming guzzler clean out project sometime in the Fall of 2018. 	Ed Ayers
