Project Description: Request to subdivide a $30.17 \pm$ gross acre parcel into three $10 \pm$ gross acre parcels in the A-2-10 (General Agriculture, 10-Acre Minimum) zoning district. The following exceptions to the County's Subdivision Ordinance are being requested as part of this project:

- An Exception to Section 20.52.170 of the Subdivision Ordinance to allow proposed Parcel 3 to take access off a County-maintained road via a 20-foot-wide proposed private access and irrigation easement.
- A Design Standard Exception to Section 20.52.160 of the County's Subdivision Ordinance is being requested due to the width to depth ratio for proposed Parcel 1.

The project site is currently planted in almond orchard and improved with one single-family dwelling, detached garage, and shop. The existing single-family dwelling is served by domestic well and private septic system. If approved, all structures will be located on proposed Parcel 1. Per Zoning Ordinance Section 21.20.020, one single-family dwelling, one accessory dwelling unit, and one junior accessory dwelling unit will be permitted per parcel. The project site is enrolled in a Williamson Act Contract and all 3 parcels will remain enrolled if approved.

Several irrigation easements exist on the project site and will cross all proposed parcels. A new 20-foot-wide private access and irrigation easement is proposed as part of this request, located on proposed Parcels 1 and 2 for the benefit of landlocked Parcel 3 to access County-maintained River Road. Parcels 1 and 2 will have road frontage on River Road.

Dear Mr. Cole:

We have conducted a records search as per your request for the above-referenced project area located on the Escalon USGS 7.5-minute quadrangle map in Stanislaus County.

Search of our files includes review of our maps for the specific project area and the immediate vicinity of the project area, and review of the following:

National Register of Historic Places (NRHP) California Register of Historical Resources (CRHR) *California Inventory of Historic Resources* (1976) *California Historical Landmarks* California Points of Historical Interest listing Office of Historic Preservation Built Environment Resource Directory (BERD) and the Archaeological Determinations of Eligibility (ADOE) *Survey of Surveys* (1989) Caltrans State and Local Bridges Inventory General Land Office Plats Other pertinent historic data available at the CCaIC for each specific county

The following details the results of the records search:

Prehistoric or historic resources within the project area:

- There are no formally recorded prehistoric or historic archaeological resources or historic buildings or structures within the project area.
- The General Land Office Survey Plat for T2S R10E (dated 1854) shows the north half of Section 8 divided into two 160-acre parcels; the 1873 General Land Office Survey Plat for T2S R10E shows the project area within the "Eight Square Leagues of Land confirmed to A B Tomson" land grant. No other historic features are referenced.
- The Official map of the County of Stanislaus, California (1906) shows Patterson and

Leitch as the historic landowners in Section 8, T2S R10E at that time.

- The Farmington USGS 15' Quadrangle (1942) shows the project area within the "Thompson Rancho."
- The Escalon USGS 7.5' Quadrangle (editions 1953 and 1968) show the River Road Lateral in the southern portion of the project area.

Prehistoric or historic resources within the immediate vicinity of the project area: There are no formally recorded prehistoric or historic archaeological resources or historic buildings or structures within the immediate vicinity of the project area, but we do caution that examples of such resources have been found elsewhere in the Escalon area within Stanislaus County.

Resources that are known to have value to local cultural groups: None has been formally reported to the Information Center.

Previous investigations within the project area: None has been formally reported to the Information Center.

Recommendations/Comments:

Please be advised that a historical resource is defined as a building, structure, object, prehistoric or historic archaeological site, or district possessing physical evidence of human activities over 45 years old. Since the project area has not been subject to previous investigations, there may be unidentified features involved in your project that are 45 years or older and considered as historical resources requiring further study and evaluation by a qualified professional of the appropriate discipline.

If the current project does not include ground disturbance, further study for archaeological resources is not recommended at this time. If ground disturbance is considered a part of the current project, we recommend further review for the possibility of identifying prehistoric or historic-era archaeological resources.

If the proposed project contains buildings or structures that meet the minimum age requirement (45 years in age or older) it is recommended that the resource/s be assessed by a professional familiar with architecture and history of the county. Review of the available historic building/structure data has included only those sources listed above and should not be considered comprehensive.

If at any time you might require the services of a qualified professional the Statewide Referral List for Historical Resources Consultants is posted for your use on the internet at http://chrisinfo.org

If archaeological resources are encountered during project-related activities, work should be temporarily halted in the vicinity of the discovered materials and workers should avoid altering the materials and their context until a qualified professional archaeologist has evaluated the

situation and provided appropriate recommendations. Project personnel should not collect cultural resources.

If human remains are discovered, California Health and Safety Code Section 7050.5 requires you to protect the discovery and notify the county coroner, who will determine if the find is Native American. If the remains are recognized as Native American, the coroner shall then notify the Native American Heritage Commission (NAHC). California Public Resources Code Section 5097.98 authorizes the NAHC to appoint a Most Likely Descendant (MLD) who will make recommendations for the treatment of the discovery.

Due to processing delays and other factors, not all of the historical resource reports and resource records that have been submitted to the State Office of Historic Preservation are available via this records search. Additional information may be available through the federal, state, and local agencies that produced or paid for historical resource management work in the search area. Additionally, Native American tribes have historical resource information not in the CHRIS Inventory, and you should contact the California Native American Heritage Commission for information on local/regional tribal contacts.

The California Office of Historic Preservation (OHP) contracts with the California Historical Resources Information System's (CHRIS) regional Information Centers (ICs) to maintain information in the CHRIS inventory and make it available to local, state, and federal agencies, cultural resource professionals, Native American tribes, researchers, and the public. Recommendations made by IC coordinators or their staff regarding the interpretation and application of this information are advisory only.
