



Announcement of Public Review Extension

This notice is to tell you of the extension of the public review period for the Draft Environmental Impact Report/Environmental Impact Statement (Draft EIR/EIS). This project is not considered a Project of Concern regarding particulate matter (PM10 and PM2.5) as defined in 40 CFR 93.123(b)(1). A detailed PM10 and PM2.5 hot-spot analysis was not completed because Clean Air Act and 40 CFR 93.116 requirements are met without an explicit hot-spot analysis. Comment is requested regarding the project-level conformity analysis. The original notice stated that comments in writing must be submitted by September 22, 2017. However, comments in writing will now be accepted until October 16, 2017. More details of where to submit written comments are provided below. The public comment period is extended to match the review date listed in the Federal Register Notice of September 1, 2017.

What is Being Planned?

The California Department of Transportation (Caltrans) and the North County Corridor Transportation Expressway Authority (NCCTEA) propose to identify a roadway alignment for a west-east facility from State Route 108 (SR-108) (McHenry Avenue) north of the City of Modesto to SR-120 approximately six miles east of the City of Oakdale. The project may be an entirely new roadway or incorporated into the existing roadway network and would serve as a bypass for the cities of Riverbank, Oakdale and Modesto. The North County Corridor Transportation Expressway Authority (NCCTEA) anticipates that the ultimate facility would be planned as a multi-lane, access-controlled expressway/freeway with interchanges, at-grade intersections, grade-separated railroad crossings, irrigation district crossings, frontage roadway, and local street alignments.

Why This Public Notice?

Caltrans has studied the effects this project may have on the environment. The report that explains the determination is called a Statement of Overriding Considerations. The report that explains why it may have a significant effect on the environment is called an Environmental Impact Report/Environmental Impact Statement (EIR/EIS). This notice is to tell you of the preparation of the Draft EIR/EIS and of its availability for public review and comment.

¿Qué están planeando?

El Departamento de Transporte de California (Caltrans) y el Condado de Stanislaus proponen identificar una alineación de camino para una instalación de oeste-este de la Ruta Estatal 108 (SR-108) (McHenry Avenue) al norte de la Ciudad de Modesto a SR-120 aproximadamente seis Millas al este de la ciudad de Oakdale. El proyecto puede ser una carretera totalmente nueva o incorporarse a la red de carreteras existente y serviría como puente para las ciudades de Riverbank, Oakdale y Modesto. La Autoridad de la Autopista de Transporte del Corredor del Condado del Norte (NCCTEA) prevé que la instalación definitiva sería planeada como una autopista multi-carril controlada por acceso con intercambios, intersecciones a nivel, cruces de ferrocarriles separados por grado, y alineaciones de calles locales.

¿Por qué este Aviso Público?

Caltrans ha estudiado los efectos que este proyecto puede tener sobre el medio ambiente. El informe que explica la determinación se denomina Declaración de Consideraciones Preliminares. El informe que explica por qué puede tener un efecto significativo sobre el medio ambiente se denomina informe de impacto ambiental / declaración de impacto ambiental (EIR / EIS). Este aviso es para informarle de la preparación del Proyecto de EIR / EIS y de su disponibilidad para su revisión y comentario público.
