

Crows Landing Road Corridor Improvement Project

The Crows Landing Road Corridor Improvement Project is located in Stanislaus County, south of the City of Modesto. Project limits starts from School Avenue to Whitmore Avenue, approximately 1.25 miles of urban stretch located just south of State Route 99. Crows Landing Road is a heavily used arterial in South Modesto, where bicycling and walking is the primary form of transportation for many disadvantaged families. The Corridor itself is used as a regional route connecting Downtown Modesto, to State Route 99, all the way down to eventually Interstate 5, approximately 35 miles southwest of the project location. The average daily traffic count from Olivero Road to Hatch Road is 24,800 during peak hours.

The Crows Landing Road Corridor Project is partly funded with Highway Safety Improvement Program (HSIP) funds. The project will include several safety improvements for pedestrian and bicyclist. The improvement will be installation of raised medians, street lighting and buffered bike lanes. The roadway will be resurfaced for buffered bike lanes, flashing beacons will be installed at the crosswalks. Existing signals will be modified and obsolete parts will be removed and salvaged. The purpose of the project is to improve safety and to help illuminate the corridor and make pedestrians and cyclist more visible to the drivers.
