Violation of this section may subject the violator to criminal prosecution. Additionally, the conveyance used to transport arms or ammunition in violation of law is subject to seizure under the provisions of Title 22, United States Code, Section 401.

**STANISLAUS COUNTY REQUIREMENTS TO SELL PISTOLS, REVOLVERS
AND OTHER FIREARMS CAPABLE OF BEING CONCEALED UPON A PERSON**

REQUIREMENTS:

1. Good moral character. Does not have an arrest record which would show a propensity to engage in conduct of a violent nature, or tends to create a history of enforcement problems.
2. Must have a current Federal Firearms License.
3. Is a resident of Stanislaus County or have a permanent business in Stanislaus County.

RENEWALS:

1. License will renew 1 year from the day issued, after the license has been reviewed by the Stanislaus County Investigative Division of the Sheriff's Office.
2. Applicant still complies with numbers 1 & 2 of the above requirement section.

COST:

1. New License: issued for 1 year at a cost of \$25.00 per order of the Stanislaus County Board of Supervisors on July 1, 1975.
2. Renewal of License: for 1 year at a cost of \$25.00 per order of the Stanislaus County Board of Supervisors on July 1, 1975. Failure to renew by renewal date will result in a \$10.00 penalty fee for late renewal.

LICENSE REVOCATION:

1. Arrest for a crime of a violent nature.
2. Conviction of a Felony.
3. Creates a history of enforcement problems after obtaining a license.

Section 12-7- of the Penal Code provides, in relevant part, that “No person shall engage in the business of selling ...firearm(s) capable of being concealed upon the person unless he has been issued a license pursuant to Section 12071.” Any person violating this section is guilty of a misdemeanor.

Penal Code Section 12071, as amended in 1972, states as follows:

“The duly constituted licensing authorities of any city or county shall accept applications for, and may grant licenses permitting the licensee to sell at retail within the county, city, town or other municipality pistols, revolvers, and other firearms capable of being concealed upon the person. If a license is granted it shall be in the form prescribed by the Attorney General, effective for not more than one year from the date of issuance, and be subject to the following conditions, for breach of any of which the license shall be subject to forfeiture.”

1. The business shall be carried on only in the building designated in the license.
2. The license or copy thereof, certified by the issuing authority, shall be displayed on the premises where it can easily be seen.
3. No firearm shall be delivered:
 - (a) Within 15 days of the application for the purchase, or within 15 days after submitting corrected copies of the register or any fee required by 12076 PC.
 - (b) Unless unloaded and securely wrapped
 - (c) Unless the purchaser either is personally known to the seller or can present clear evidence of his/her identity.
 - (d) Whenever the dealer is notified by the department that a purchaser is in a prohibited class described in Section 12021 or 12021.1 of the Penal Code or Section 8100 or 8103 of the Welfare and Institutions Code.
4. No pistol or revolver, or other firearm capable of being concealed upon the person or imitation thereof, or placard advertising the sale or other transfer thereof, shall be displayed in any part of the premises where it can readily be seen from the outside.
5. The licensee shall agree to and shall act properly and promptly in processing transfers of firearms pursuant to Section 12082 of the Penal Code.
6. No person licensed under Section 12071 shall sell, deliver, or transfer any firearm capable of being concealed upon the person to any person under the age of 21 years.
7. If the Dealer moves his business to a different location, he shall notify the Licensing Authority (Stanislaus County Treasurer & Tax Collector’s Office) of such fact in writing within 48 hours.
