The data information pulled will help to work and complete the annual assessment after execution of the MOU. - Ethnicity - Language - Age - Gender 2. <u>Screening and Referrals: '24-Q4, '25-Q1, '25-Q2</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Data is pulled from three departments teams, Behavioral Health Case Management, Social Services, Case Management and the Behavioral Health Treatment team, that manages the under 21 population. The trend shows the increase, but it should level out as providers and members are educated. The increase is expected to decrease quarter-to-quarter for the rest of the year. It's been reported staff are receiving good responses and turnaround time on the transition and care tools from the health plan, HPSJ.</p> <p>Kristy requested handout information to help the programs and member's understanding of the extra services, the case management, the ECM and Community Supports. 	<p><u>Paula/ SUD</u>: Provided information and welcomed the health plan to join the Stanislaus County Opioid Safety Coalition on the second Thursday of each month from 9:00 am to 10:30am.</p> <p>SUD would like more information knowing what the processes are on the SUD side, how to refer to recovery residences, and how to do a referral. And agreed programs would benefit by having a training for staff presented by HPSJ.</p> <p><u>Alyssa, Coordinator /Access Crisis & Support</u>: Requests for more information on services, referral pathways, and education materials to keep members informed about services for non-screened members of specialty mental health when referrals are sent back</p> <p>Gabriela will coordinate with Katrina and Alyssa to provide email contacts and information regarding the SFTP access for the closing of the loop; Gabriela and Alyssa will discuss offline to get the spreadsheet initiated and completed by the new Access Coordinator.</p> <p><u>Deborah / CCMU</u>: Reports the blending of two systems Crisis, Access, and Medication system of care. Teams are combined with Mobile Crisis, CERT and Access and Medication and are one big team. Pending is a name change for the entire system. CERT is the hospital team and the previous CCMU is the mobile team. The clinicians for the teams are interchangeable and are crossed trained or are being cross trained to perform all those duties.</p> <p><u>Rachal / Crisis (formerly CERT)</u>: CERT has transitioned to the Crisis team, which is the unofficial name. We continue to see our members at the hospitals or out in the community and everybody is in the process of being trained. We are short staffed but are hoping to gain more staff in the coming weeks, and months.
