QUALIFICATIONS

The CASRA Based Stipend Program supports students who are enrolled at Modesto Junior College and are interested in knowing more about the mental health field and is a student who...

1. Has lived experience as a consumer or a family member of a consumer of behavioral health services.
2. Is attending, or planning to attend Modesto Junior College
3. Meets “hard-to-fill/desired” position requirements under the categories of ethnicity, culture, multilingual, or nationality.

The CASRA Based Stipend Program supports students who are registered in the following classes require to enter the MJC Psychosocial Rehabilitation Program. Below is the list of classes that will allow you to be a participant on our Program:

- HUMSR 101** - Introduction to Human Services
- HUMSR 142** - Introduction to Psychosocial Rehabilitation
- HUMSR 143** - Psychosocial Rehabilitation Practice
- HUMSR 146** - Psychosocial Rehabilitation with Children / Families
- HUMSR 110** - Introduction to Interviewing & Counseling
- HUMSR 120** - Ethical & Professional Issues
- HUMSR 147** - Field Studies & Seminar

While classes do not necessarily have to be taken in the above order; the order is presented is due to prerequisite courses needed.

Modesto Junior College’s Psychosocial Rehabilitation (PSR) Program

The Psychosocial Rehabilitation (PSR) program comes from the emerging need in the human services field to recruit and hire qualified persons to provide services for people who have mental health problems, including consumers and family members as employees in the mental health system.

Completion of the Psychosocial Rehabilitation program will provide the SKILLS RECOGNITION holder with a core curriculum of essential skills necessary for jobs in the human services field and provide the nine units of college credit necessary to sit for the national test-based certification exam, enabling people to become Certified Psychosocial Rehabilitation Practitioners.

This core set of courses not only provides a basic education for people entering the human services profession but also provides training and growth opportunities for existing human service employees.

In addition, this SKILLS RECOGNITION will serve as another step in an educational and career ladder leading to a Human Services SKILLS RECOGNITION Certificate and/or Degree.

All coursework will be applicable as electives and/or meet some of the requirements for the Human Service AA degree at MJC.
