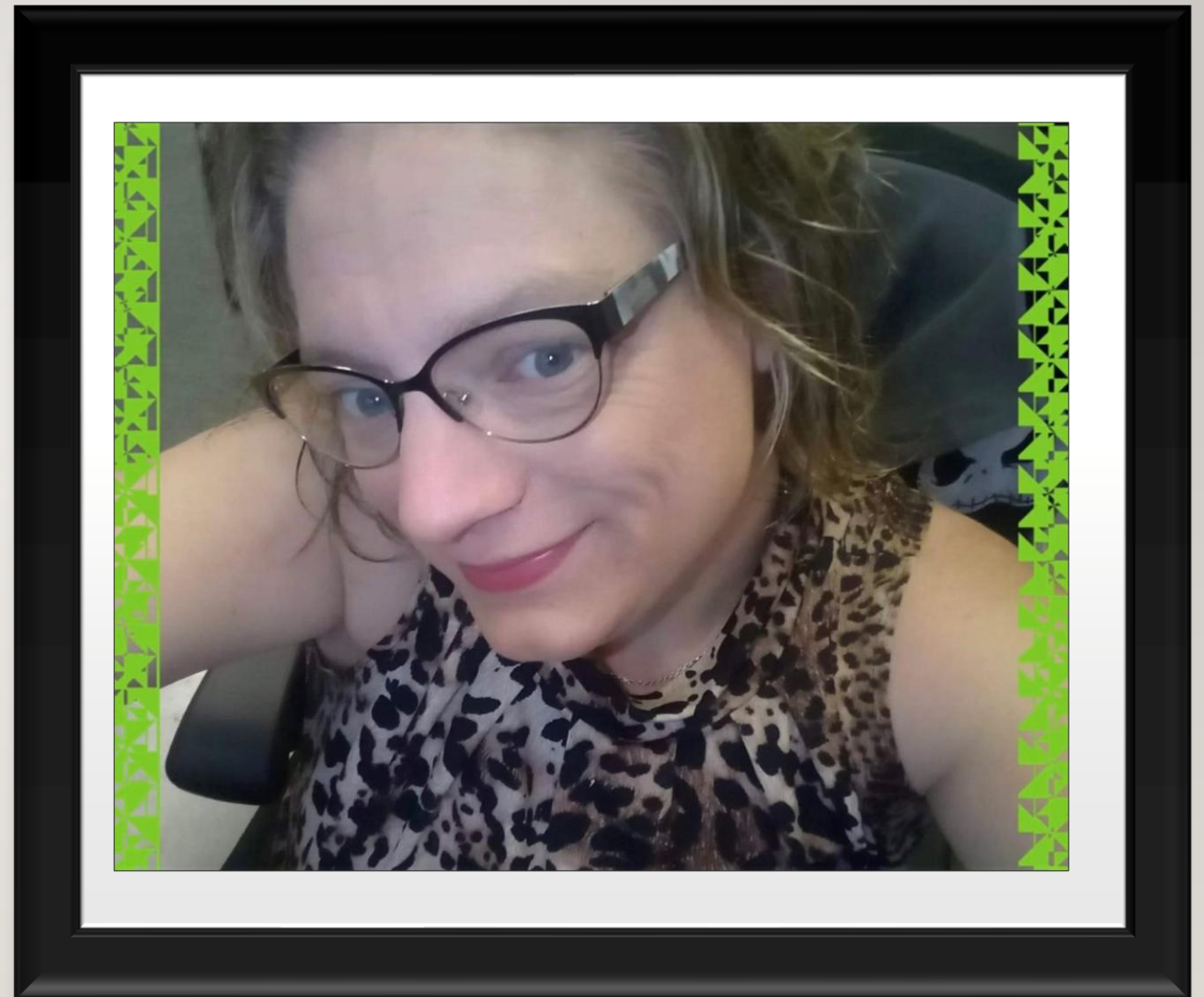

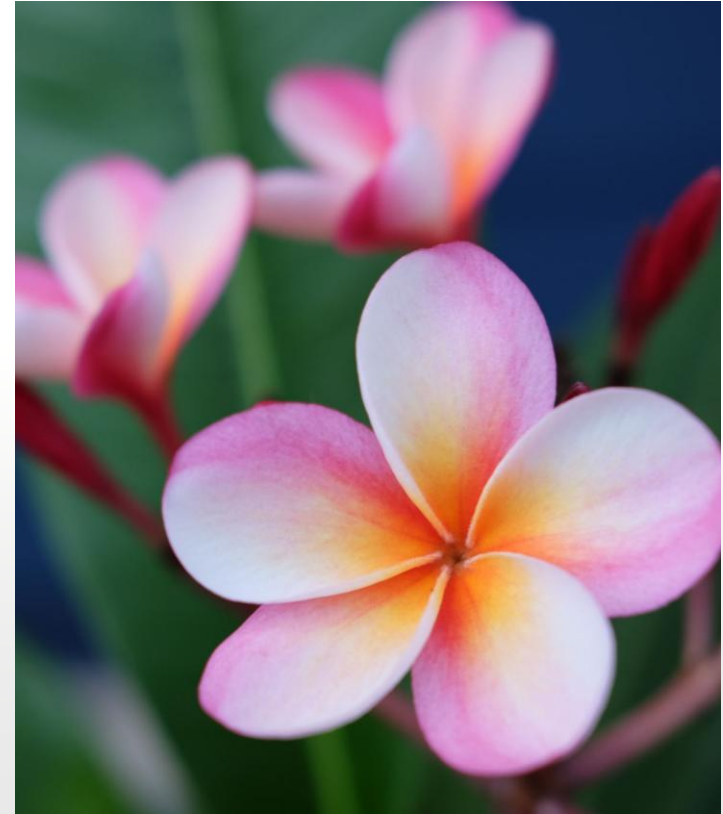

Volunteers provide an important and valuable services as they work in county-wide BHRS Programs.

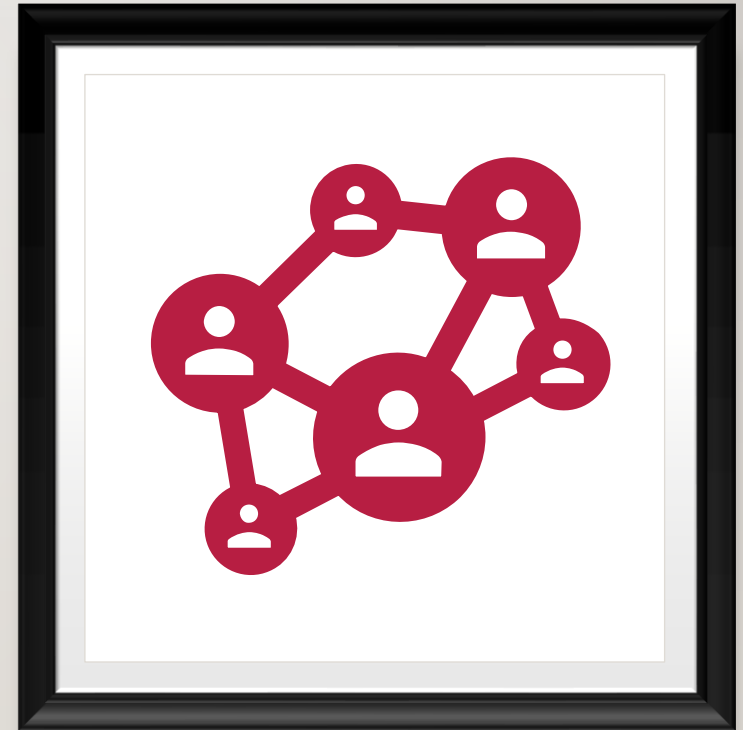
MISSION

The certificated units also count towards an Associate of Arts Degree in Human Services at MJC.
