Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion Newsletter: Assisted Outpatient Treatment	Melissa Hale, LCSW Mental Health Coordinator	<p>The Treatment Advocacy Center published a recent survey reviewing Assisted Outpatient Treatment in California. According to the survey, "California is home to almost one million individuals with severe and persistent mental illness, as many as half of whom are untreated on any given day." (Treatment Advocacy Center. "A Promising Start... Results from a California Survey Assessing the Use of Laura's Law." 06 Feb 2019. https://www.treatmentadvocacycenter.org/a-promising-start). These individuals often have frequent contact with emergency services and law enforcement. Through these contacts it became clear that these individuals do not appear to engage in traditional outpatient mental health treatment and fall through the cracks in the Mental Health Treatment System.
