August 11, 2020

*Supervisor Berryhill attended via teleconference pursuant to Governor Newsom's Executive Order N-25-20.

Invocation was given by Pastor Lyn Crase with Emmanuel Lutheran Church.

CEO Hayes, Public Health Officer Dr. Vaishampayan, and Assistant Director of Emergency Services Richard Murdock provided an update related to the 2019 Novel Coronavirus (COVID-19) emergency and essential services in Stanislaus County.

Supervisor Withrow requested staff to research holding a Special Meeting next week to review board authorities related to COVID-19 and reopening schools.

John Mataka voiced concerns regarding telephone public comments no longer being available during Board meetings. He spoke regarding the need for more resources on the West Side of the County and asked how much money is earmarked for farmworkers in response to COVID-19. He expressed concerns about schools reopening and children bringing home the virus to adult family members. He also read a letter from Michael Garcia with the GI Forum, regarding the need for increased COVID-19 outreach and testing in the Latino community.

Miguel Donoso shared concerns regarding the effects of COVID-19 on farmworkers and fear of retaliation. He also spoke about navigators that are assisting businesses with completing grant applications and the need for interpretation to Spanish. He also expressed concerns regarding CEO Hayes.

Katherine Borges shared her experience with COVID-19 testing.

Warner Road, between East Keyes Road and East Taylor Road, in the Keyes and Turlock area; adopted the Mitigated Negative Declaration pursuant to CEQA Guidelines Section 15074(b), by finding that, on the basis of the whole record, including the Initial Study and any comments received, that there is no substantial evidence the project will have a significant effect on the environment and that the Mitigated Negative Declaration reflects Stanislaus County's independent judgment and analysis; ordered the filing of a Notice of Determination with the Stanislaus County Clerk Recorder's Office pursuant to Public Resources Code Section 21152 and CEQA Guidelines Section 15075.4; finds that: (a) the project is consistent with the overall goals and policies of the County General Plan (b) the proposed Planned Development zoning is consistent with the Planned Development General Plan designation (c) the project will increase activities in and around the project area, and increase demands for roads and services, thereby requiring dedication and improvements (d) the alternative to the Agricultural Buffer Standards applied to this project provides equal or greater protection than the existing buffer standards; approved Rezone Application No. PLN2017-0098-Best RV Center, subject to the Development Standards and

Mitigation Measures, attached to the agenda item, including the deletion of Development Standards Nos. 13 and 14, and amendments to Nos. 15 and 26; introduced, waived the reading, and adopted Ordinance C.S. 1278 – Planning ORD-56-W-2 2020-0417 & 2020-0418
