B. Condit/C. Condit (3-0)(Withrow and Grewal recused) 6.C.1 Authorized the Road Commissioner to utilize a sole source exemption for the purchase of road construction materials where there is no competitive advantage to bidding out such materials; approved the purchase of road construction materials from the 10 quarries/plants closest to the jobsite location where construction is occurring; authorized the Purchasing Agent to approve any Purchase Order for road construction materials, including aggregates, both hot and cold mix asphalt concrete, tack oil, and both structural and low-strength concrete, cumulative expenditure from any given quarry/plant and all quarries/plants combined not-to-exceed the approved budgetary expenditures of \$1,950,000 in Road and Bridge Legal Budget Unit, Maintenance Cost Center for materials and \$8,825,000 in Road and Bridge Project Cost Center for projects during FY 2027; and, authorized the Road Commissioner to take any appropriate action necessary to carry out the purpose and intent of these recommendations – PW

Withrow/Grewal unan. 8.1 Approved the Behavioral Health Services Act Three-Year Integrated Plan for FYs 2026-2029; authorized the Chairman to sign the Board of Supervisors Certification for the Behavioral Health Services Act Three-Year Integrated Plan for FYs 2026-2029; authorized the Behavioral Health Director to sign the Behavioral Health Director Certification for the Behavioral Health Services Act Three-Year Integrated Plan for FYs 2026-2029; and, authorized the Behavioral Health Director to submit the Three-Year Integrated Plan for FYs 2026-2029, along with all other required certifications and documents, to the Department of Health Care Services and the Behavioral Health Services Oversight and Accountability Commission – BHRS

B. Condit/Chiesa (4-1)(C. Condit opposed) unan. **8.2** Adopted a policy for technology disruptions that affect remote public access during Stanislaus County Board of Supervisors meetings – CEO

C. Condit/Grewal unan. **8.3 Amended** the item to add Staff Recommendation No. 2, approved Staff Recommendation Nos. 1 and 2 as amended as follows: (1) accepted an update on language access services using technology solutions; and, (2) directed staff to return to the Board in six months for review – CEO

Corr 1 Referred to Planning, a letter from the Modesto City Schools regarding the increase of their school facilities fees for residential and commercial/industrial development.

Corr 2 Referred to the Clerk-Recorder and Registrar of Voters, a notice from the Westley Community Services District regarding a vacancy on their Board of Directors due to the resignation of Ida Tucker.

Corr 3 Referred to the Auditor-Controller's Office, a copy of the Stanislaus Local Agency Formation Commission (LAFCO) FY 2026-2027 Budget.

Corr 4 Referred to the CEO's Office, the 2025-2026 Stanislaus County Civil Grand Jury's report regarding Riding Into the Sunset on Unapproved Cash: Misuse of Vacation Policy at the Stanislaus Council of Governments.

B. Condit reported that last week he attended CSAC in Kings County, where they discussed repurposed fallowed land. He also shared that tomorrow, 06/17/2026 at 9:00 a.m., there will be a ribbon-cutting ceremony for the Urban Pocket Area 41 Topeka-Santa Fe Infrastructure Improvement Project in Riverbank at 6600 Claus Road.

C. Condit reported that this Saturday, 06/20/2026, from 7:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m., there will be a Ceres Community Cleanup at 4033 Central Avenue.

Chairman Chiesa reported that he, along with Supervisor Withrow, CEO Hayes, and PIO Lucas, traveled to Washington, D.C., for the County's annual federal advocacy trip.

AEO Warr reported that Chairman Chiesa signed onto a coalition letter coordinated by the San Joaquin Valley Regional Association of California Counties (SJVRACC) opposing SB 1329 (McNerney). She also noted that late yesterday evening, the State Assembly and Senate completed action on a budget framework and transmitted the main budget bill, AB 109, to the Governor. She shared staff are currently reviewing the Assembly Floor Report and other budget materials to assess potential impacts to county programs and services.
