#### D. Action Items:

1. Approval of Minutes from the PFF Committee Meeting from July 17, 2025. Minutes may be voted on by those Members in attendance.

A Motion was made to approve the PFF Committee Meeting Minutes from July 17, 2025.

2. Consider the request from Self-Help Enterprises (SHE) & Stanislaus Equity Partners (STEP) for a deferral of fees for McClure Meadows. This is the first SHE program in Modesto. This project consists of 39 single family homes for family's earning 80% or less of the Area Median Stanislaus County Public Facilities Fees Committee Meeting Minutes – August 21, 2025

Income (AMI). Homes purchased through this program must be the buyer's primary residence. Audits will be conducted to ensure that the homes are occupied by the buyers.

A motion was made to approve the request from Self-Help Enterprises & Stanislaus Equity Partners (STEP) for a deferral of fees for McClure Meadows.

3. Consider the request from the Health Services Agency (HSA) to use \$7,495,740 from Public Facilities Funds (Fund 6406/2406) for the purchase of North Point Tower and tenant improvements.

Andy Johnson, Director of the General Services Agency, submitted the funding request on behalf of HSA. HSA is currently housed in North Point Tower. With the goal of securing a permanent location for the Community Services Agency (CSA), an opportunity arose to purchase the building.

Supervisors Grewal and Withrow both support the purchase. Chairwoman Doud inquired about the building's zoning, and Director Johnson indicated that the zoning was appropriate to move forward with the project.

A motion was made to approve the request from Health Services Agency to use \$7,495,740 in Public Facilities Funds for North Point Towers Purchase and Tenant Improvements from 6406/2406 fund.

4. Consider the request from General Services Agency to use \$107,280 in Public Facilities Funds for Bonita Pool Playground Project (Fund 2413).

Andy Johnson, Director of the General Services Agency shared that this is Phase II of the Bonita Pool Project. This phase includes installation of new playground, adult exercise equipment, picnic area and other park amenities such as benches and walking paths. The playground is envisioned to be available for use in late spring/early summer 2026.

A motion was made to approve request from General Services Agency to use \$107,280 in Public Facilities Funds for Bonita Pool Playground Project (Fund 2413).

5. Consider the request from the Sheriff's Office to use \$127,998 in Public Facilities Funds for New Courthouse Furniture (Fund Detention)

Andy Johnson, Director of the General Services Agency submitted the funding request on behalf of the Sheriff's office. The State of California is building Stanislaus Superior Court to modern standards. The County is required to provide deputy services at this courthouse and is responsible to procure its own furnishings, including new modern radio equipment (not included in this request) as well as furnishings for the County staff areas.

6. A motion was made to approve the request from the Sheriff's Office to use \$127,998 in Public Facilities Funds for New Courthouse Furniture (Fund Detention)

7. Consider the request from Parks & Recreation to use \$570,000 in Public Facilities Funds for Laird Regional Park Parking lot (Fund 2405)

Vinal Chand Manager IV from Parks and Recreation made a presentation that Laird Regional Park consists of 97 acres of land, 30 of which has been developed so far for recreational purposes and are open to the public. This project includes 450 new parking stalls including ADA stalls, drainage swales, fencing modifications, landscape irrigation modifications, prep work for solar lighting, electronic pay stations and security camera system and a paved rehabilitation for park access road. The parking lot will support special events, various regional park activities and allow for continued future growth of park features.

A motion was made to approve the request from Parks & Recreation to use \$570,000 in Public Facilities Funds for Laird Regional Park Parking lot (Fund 2405).

#### **Project Description:**

The General Services Agency (GSA) Facilities Maintenance Shop is located on the Public Safety Center Campus at 250 East Hackett Road in Modesto and has been located here since the Public Safety Center was opened in the 1990's. The facility is home to GSA Maintenance Team and the Lock Shop (28 Employees (27 Full Time, 1 Part-Time)). Since 2020, the team has added two positions; however, has not acquired any new space to support the 2.5 million square feet of County space serviced.

To alleviate space concerns, GSA temporarily located approximately half of this team to County Center II in 2020; however, this property was declared as surplus by the Board of Supervisors and GSA re-consolidated that team back to the Hackett site. The space is considered undersized, having only one non-Americans with Disabilities Act. (ADA) compliant available restroom, one office, and small breakroom. Three small four by four cubicles, recycled from another facility are the only dedicated space available for the County's team of Maintenance Engineers I/II to submit time cards, participate in training, close out work orders, and respond to email communication. If approved, this project will expand the working space into a bay currently utilized for storage of equipment. The plan will create dedicated office space for the Maintenance and Facilities Manager and for two Supervisors. It will also add a second restroom which will comply with ADA regulations in the facility, a small conference room and a new breakroom. The project includes funding for construction and for furnishings and equipment.

#### **Project Description:**

Fleet Maintenance supports an estimated 1,200 County owned vehicles, plus numerous watercraft, trailers, and specialty vehicles. In January of 2024, the State of California's California Air Resources Board (CARB) issued the Advance Clean Fleet regulation, governing public fleet electronification in California. Under this legislation Counties are required to purchase 50% of new vehicles weighing over 8,500 pounds as Zero Emission Vehicles (ZEV-Electric). This will increase to 100 % by January 2027. By 2035 only ZEV may be purchased by public agencies. Penalties for failed compliance are up to \$10,000 per vehicles per day. Both Public Works and GSA are procuring the necessary vehicles to ensure compliance with the law.

In addition, Executive Order N-79-20 was issued by Govener Gavin Newsom in 2020, which set a goal of 100% of new vehicles in the State of California be electric by 2035. To prepare for this change in vehicle type, the County will need to install electric vehicle chargers. Staff have retained an electrical engineer and have prepared plans and specifications for two initial sites. The first project will to be install 350kw chargers at the Fleet Maintenance Shop. A second site is planned for 800 Scenic Avenue, adjacent to the Behaviorual Health and Recovery (BHRS) site. 350kw is the highest available charging station at this time and the only size charger that can effectively charge vehicles of this size. Future charges will most likely be necessary as requirements shift from heavy vehicles to smaller passenger cars.

Phase I, Fleet Services is anticipated to begin in early 2026, subject to final approval from the Department of Energy. Phase II is anticipated to begin in Fall 2026 and be completed in early 2027.

SUBJECT: PUBLIC FACILITIES FEE INCENTIVE AUDIT

The purpose of this report is to provide the Public Facilities Fees (PFF) Large Industrial Incentive Program audit results for S2A Modular 2, LLC (S2A Modular). The audit was conducted to verify the materialization of the assumptions made in the application by S2A Modular that was approved at the Public Facilities Fees Committee meeting on June 15, 2023. This audit, conducted by Stanislaus County Workforce Development, is consistent with the PFF Large Industrial Incentive program guidelines.

#### PUBLIC FACILITIES FEES LARGE INDUSTRIAL INCENTIVE PROGRAM:

The large Industrial Investment Incentive Program (the "Program") was developed to assist the facilitation of job creation in Stanislaus County in the industrial sector. The incentive applies a discount on the amount of fees paid based on a sliding scale, with the maximum discount reaching 50% in the Manufacturing sector and up to 60% in the Warehouse and Distribution sectors.

#### PROJECT APPLICANT:

S2A Modular planned a factory to manufacture modular housing with a projected total capital investment of \$30 million, a project size of 100,050 square feet of factory space, and the creation of 25 new jobs at an average hourly wage of \$30.98. S2A Modular completed construction and started production at its manufacturing plant in Patterson, CA on January 1, 2022.

#### FINDINGS AT YEAR ONE:

S2A Modular provided documentation that showed the total capital investment at the end of year one was \$23,417,541.63. This equates to 78% of the promised \$30 million as stated in the application. S2A Modular reached the \$30 million capital investment by April 2025, however, at the end of year one they fell short of their intended goal.

By the end of year one, S2A Modular created 13 new jobs at the required minimum of 35 hours per week, which is 52% of the 25 jobs promised. A total of 31 jobs were created (29 hourly employees and 2 management positions), but the majority were fewer than the 35 hours. The







newly generated jobs included foreman, general construction, administration, maintenance, electrical, production, quality inspector, and janitor.

The calculated average hourly wage for all 29 on-site employees (including those with fewer than 35 hours per week, but excluding management), was \$26.38, which equates to 85% of the promised \$30.98. During the first year, the hourly wages ranged from \$22 to \$30 per hour with a median wage of \$26 per hour. With only 4 employees earning \$30 per hour, an average hourly wage of \$30.98 was not achievable. California's minimum wage in 2022 was \$15 per hour for employers with 25 or more employees. S2A Modular's \$26.38 average hourly wage was 76% above the State's \$15 minimum wage.\*

#### INDIRECT ECONOMIC BENEFIT:

Economic benefits go beyond the direct initial job generation that occurs with a new business or development. To estimate the impact of the new manufacturing plant we have included the results of an impact scenario model by Lightcast. The estimated economic impact includes initial, direct, indirect, and induced effects. According to Lightcast, the initial effect on earnings by the addition of 13 jobs is \$799,209. The direct effect which is due to inter-industry effects is \$159,870, which represents the first round of impacts by the new industry. The indirect effect, which is \$41,509, reflects the subsequent ripple effect in further supply chains resulting from the direct change. The induced effects reflect the impact of the initial, direct, and indirect changes. Induced effects enter the economy as employees spend their paychecks in the region, businesses invest to grow their operations, and the government spends more to support the changes. The induced effect is estimated by the impact scenario to be \$171,159 in additional earnings above the initial job creation (attachment 1).

For the initial 13 jobs created at S2A Modular, an estimated additional 6 support jobs were added to the local economy. The initial, direct, indirect, and induced jobs equated to a total of 19 jobs for the region. The Lightcast impact scenario estimates the local, State, and Federal taxes generated on production and imports for the added jobs to be \$82,459.

#### SUMMARY:

S2A Modular's capital investment was less than planned, job creation was half of what was stated in the application, and the average hourly wage fell short of their goal. However, the average hourly wage was substantially higher than the minimum wage at the time, and the factory generated some additional benefits to the community including the Green Factor and perhaps the Community Need bonus factors described in the Program.

S2A Modular stated the Patterson factory was the first and only Net Zero factory in the United States. During our audit visit to the factory, S2A Modular explained that all of their power needs were met by a Tesla Mega Pack and solar panels. In addition, the building has a transparent roof which reduces the need for lighting during daylight hours. By our observation, S2A Modular qualifies for the Green Factor Bonus.





S2A Modular claims to meet the Community Need bonus factor for the Program by building affordable housing. The Patterson factory produces modular units that can be made into a variety of structures including accessory dwelling units (ADUs), single family residences, tiny homes, as well as commercial buildings. While a need for affordable housing exists, we were unable to determine whether S2A Modular fulfilled that need within the first year.

\*Percentage change was calculated by subtracting \$15 from \$26.38, then dividing \$11.38 by \$15 and multiplying by 100, which yields 75.8667% change or increase.

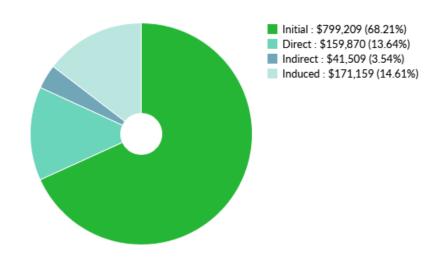

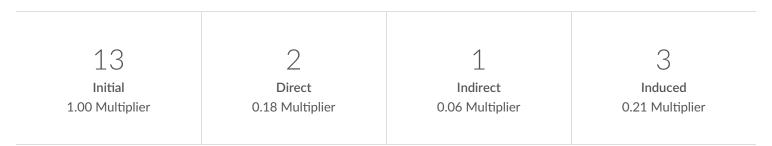

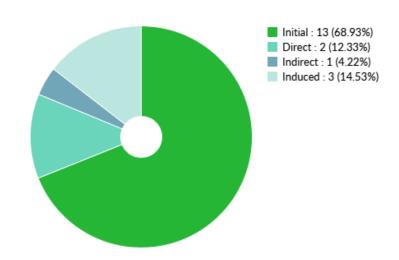
## Effect on earnings from adding 13 jobs to Manufactured Home (Mobile Home) Manufacturing
