VI. Riverbank Armory Area and the Federal/State Proposal – Rob Kostlivy

County has met with US Army in regards to the Ammunition plant. The Army suggests the County place a moratorium at this site. Doing so would allow them to wash their hands of anything that is out there. This would tamper with a lot of business activity, and infringe on AG community as well as domestic sites. The County is not in the position to create a moratorium. The Army sent over a draft ordinance that was utilized to create one in Monterrey and after reviewing it and the map, the map is incorrect. More conversations are to be had over the next few months in regards to this.

Richard O'Brien (Mayor of Riverbank) spoke on the Army being taken as a Super Fund. He stated the Army has taken the task seriously to clean up the plume. For the last 30 years, they have been doing the remediation as prescribed by the water board and the USEPA district 9. Richard believes that the county doing the DPSC's job is untenable.
